1971 TCU LETTERMEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES



L. C. PROCTOR (Class of '07)

Baseball letterman 1905-06-07-08. Captain 1907. Player and coach 1908. Played 3 years of professional baseball in Texas League and Georgia-Alabama League. Former official for SWC games. President of Alumni Association in 1908-1910. Football manager 2 years. Father of Ben Proctor, member of TCU History Department and former Texas grid great.

H. H. "Slim" KINZY (Class of '34)

All Southwest Conference pitcher for TCU in 1932-33-34. Top star on TCU's 1934 SWC baseball champions, winning seven of the team's nine league victories. Compiled a 16-6 SWC career record. Signed with the Chicago White Sox after finishing here. Also, was a top baseball player here, starting on TCU's 1934 SWC Championship team.



WALTER ROACH (Class of '37)

First TCU player ever to win All-SWC honors for three years in a row. Was captain of 1936 team which played in the first Cotton Bowl. Earned a varsity letter at TCU playing football, basketball and baseball. Served as assistant football coach at TCU from 1937 until 1966. Is now Director of TCU Placement Bureau.

BUSTER BRANNON (Class of '33)

Outstanding TCU basketball coach from 1948-67. Won more SWC basketball titles than any other coach. Southpaw quarterback for Frogs 1930-32. Earned All-SWC honors, as guard in basketball on 1932-33 teams. Regular on school's first SWC championship team in 1931. Retired as head basketball coach in March, 1967, and is now TCU's Assistant Athletic Director.





JOHNNY VAUGHT (Class of '33)

Unanimous All-American guard and team captain on TCU's 1932 SWC championship team. All-SWC in 1931 and 1932. His line play was a big factor in Frog's tough defense in 1932 when his team set the school record for fewest yards allowed in one season. Three-year letterman in basketball. Compiled a 163-48-11 record at Mississippi.
