# 1972 TCU LETTERMEN'S HALL OF FAME

## INDUCTEES



**JOHN NELSON** (Class of 1917)

Football, baseball and basketball star at TCU in period just prior to the United States entry into World War I. Lettered in 1914-15-16 in these sports. Captained teams in basketball and baseball. Wounds suffered in France prevented further athletic competition.

**JOHN McDiarmid** (Class of 1931)

One of the US's foremost tennis players in the 1930's. Son of a TCU professor, McDiarmid was ranked #7 by US Lawn Tennis Association in 1936. Played tournament tennis from 1928, when a TCU freshman, until 1938. Captain and #1 player of the Frogs in 1930 and 1931. Won seven singles championships. Won US doubles championship.

**NOBLE ATKINS** (Class of 1931)

First string center and linebacker for TCU's first SWC championship team in 1929. All-SWC center in 1929-30. Captain of 1930 team. Won MVP award in 1930. Starting guard and captain of 1931 team that won TCU's first SWC basketball championship. All-SWC in basketball. Won seven varsity letters in three sports, the other being baseball.

**LINDY BERRY** (Class of 1950)

Quarterback for Frogs in 1946-49. All-SWC in 1948 and 1949. All-America in 1949. Captain and winner of Dan Rogers award in 1949. Holds the following career records: most yards total offense, most plays, most punt return yardage, most kickoff returns, most yards on kickoff returns, most yards on interception returns.



**JIM SWINK** (Class of 1957)

Greatest running back in TCU history. All-America in 1955 & 1956. Runner-up for Heisman Trophy as a junior in 1955. Captain in 1956. Still holds 15 school records including most yards rushing and most points scored. Also lettered in basketball in 1956. Now a prominent Orthopedic surgeon.
