JOHNNY WASHMON (Class of '27)

Outstanding halfback for Frogs in 1924-25-26. All-SWC in 1925. Great field goal kicker. Nickname was "Three Point Johnny". His boots beat Texas A&M twice and Oklahoma A&M once. Captain of 1926 team. Lettered four years (1924-27) as catcher in baseball.

CHARLIE NEEDHAM

(Class of '37)

Lettered as an end on 1936 Cotton Bowl Champions. Served many years as SWC football official. Has worked many years as non-paid chairman of Greater Fort Worth Sports Committee and as a leader in the highly successful Golden Gloves program. For his service has received citation by North Texas Chapter of National Football Hall of Fame.



JUDGE A. D. GREEN (Class of '23)

Outstanding tackle for the Frogs in 1920-21-22-23. Captain of the 1922 team. Also, earned letters in track in 1920-21-22. Retired County Judge of Wilbarger County. Appointed a member of the Board of Trustees at TCU in 1960. Serves as an active member of the Athletic Council.



All-SWC guard on the Frogs' undefeated 1932 championship team. Lettered in football in 1930-31-32. Joined the Green Bay Packers in 1933 and was a regular through five seasons. Chosen All-Pro in 1935-36-37. Has been the Sheriff of Tarrant County since 1961.





BRUCE ALFORD

(Class of '42)

Captain of 1942 Frogs, winning grid letters in 1940-41-42. Most valuable player in 1942. Was leading pass receiver that year. All-SWC in 1941-42. Also lettered in baseball in 1941. Played professional football after graduation. Currently serves as a professional football official.
