

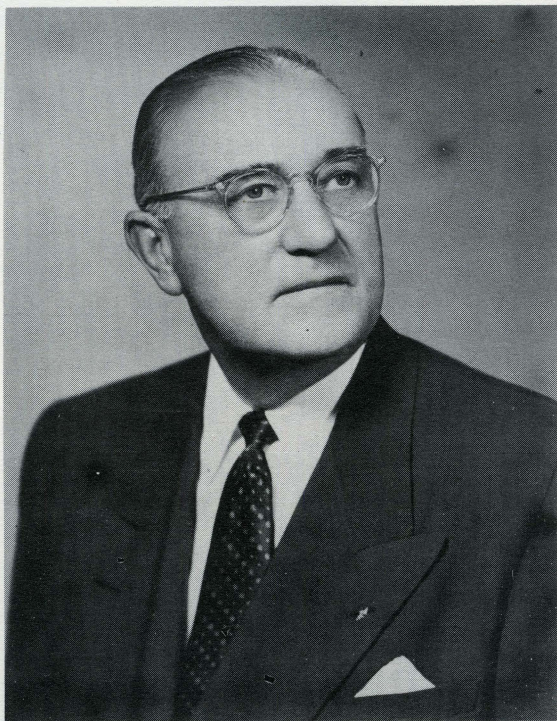

Noel L. Keith is chairman of the Department of Religion at Texas Christian University. He is constantly working toward providing opportunities for students who wish a first class college education.



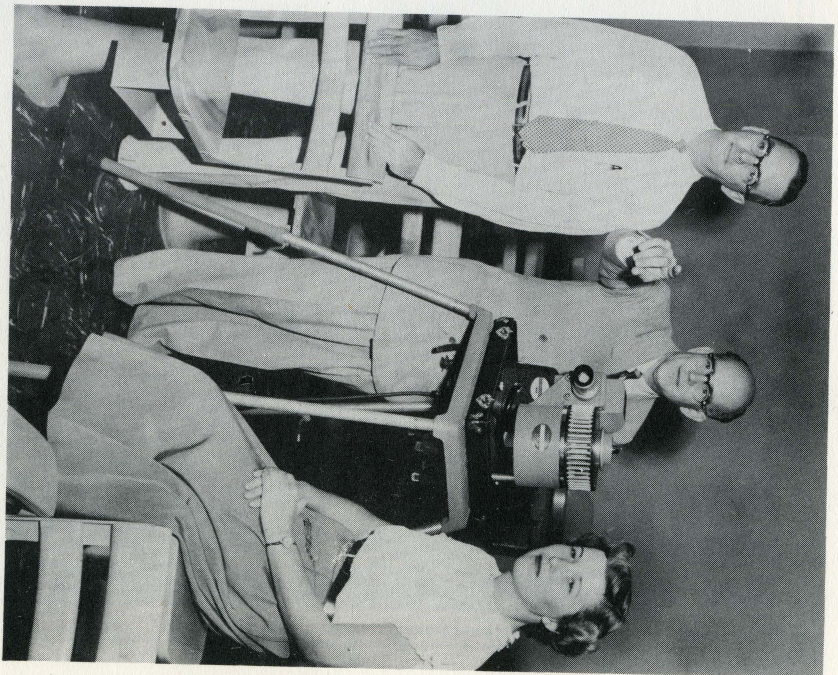
Dr. Funk

Dr. Edens

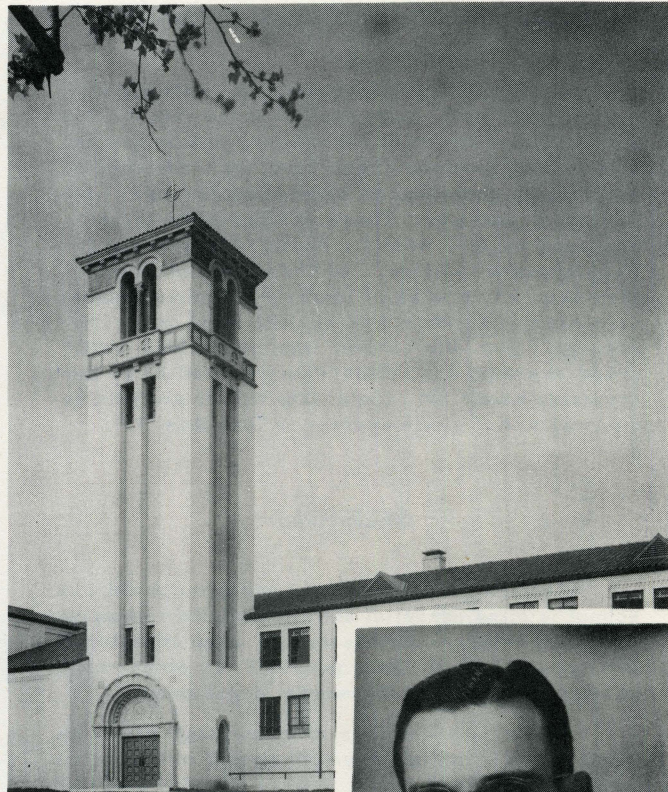

UNDERGRADUATE MINISTERIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A maximum of 200 scholarships, with the total value of \$800 each, to be applied at the rate of \$100 per semester for eight semesters, will be granted high school graduates who have been certified by their local churches as candidates for full-time Christian service. These scholarships must be approved by Dr. Noel L. Keith, Chairman of the Department of Religion. For any student who carries less than full academic load (15 semester hours) scholarship benefits the student must make "B" average. For any student who maintained a "C" grade average, the scholarship rate will be \$5 per semester hour. No scholarship will be awarded to students whose grade average is less than "C".

SELF-HELP

Realizing that part-time employment while in school is often essential and that full-time employment upon leaving school is the goal of an educational program, T. C. U. has provided an employment service in its Student Personnel department.

Those who desire either on-campus or off-campus part-time employment should contact Mrs. Florence Zuefeldt of the Student Personnel office. Many students are able to help defray their college expenses by this method.

Students working for the University are expected to apply their wages on unpaid University accounts, and will not receive cash until the accounts are paid in full.

Prospective employers are being contacted systematically and many excellent opportunities are being made available. Proper employment while in school can make a great contribution to the educational experience and finding the position after graduation that is most appropriate can be the climaxing event of a college life.

Majors and Minors In Religion

- I. **For Christian young people and adults who wish to become more efficient workers in the Kingdom** as teachers, directors of boys and girls clubs, missionary leaders, and other church officials. Major of 27 semester hours, or minor of 18 semester hours, in Religion, on a Bachelor of Arts Degree.
- II. **Students who are especially interested in Church Music** may take a major in Religion and a minor in Music on the Bachelor of Arts Degree, or a double major in Religion and Music on a Degree of Bachelor of Music. For requirements, see Texas Christian University catalog, Music Department.
- III. **For students who wish to prepare for the work of Church Administration**, with a major of 27 semester hours in Religion and a specially planned minor of 20 semester hours in the School of Business, on a Bachelor of Arts Degree.
- IV. **For young men and women who wish to start their preparation for becoming Directors of Religious Education**, with an undergraduate major of 27 semester hours or a carefully selected minor of 18 semester hours, in Religion, on a Bachelor of Arts Degree.
- V. **For ministerial students who intend to complete their vocational training in a graduate seminary**, but who feel the need of background courses in Religion which are taught in the Undergraduate Department as electives or to fulfill requirements for a major or minor on the Bachelor of Arts Degree.
- VI. **For prospective missionaries** who expect to engage in various types of missionary activities in home and foreign fields.
