SINCE 1873 Texas Christian University has had a major role in the religious teaching of Christian leaders. Over a thousand ministers have been trained and sent out to all parts of the world. Believing that wholesome, intelligent, creative religion is the indispensable basis of good life and the essential foundation of Democracy, an honest effort is being made at the University to give to all students an understanding and appreciation of the fundamental ideals of Religion and to help them achieve a positive, Christian philosophy of life.

THE NEW School of Religion building which includes the Robert Carr Chapel is planned as a means of making more effective the training of Christian leaders. The increasing enrollment, and the inadequacy of the present structures where classes in biblical and religious instruction are held, makes the erection of the new building imperative.

The Robert Carr Chapel will be built with funds contributed for that purpose of Mr. Robert Carr, San Angelo, Texas.

The educational building which is to be constructed in conjunction with the Robert Carr Chapel will meet the needs of both the undergraduate Department of Religion of the Add-Ran College of Arts and Sciences, and the Brite College of the Bible, the theological seminary of the University.

Texas Christian University's School of Religion is to be constructed on the lots across the street north of the Mary Couts Burnett Library, near the Memorial Entrance to the main campus and Administration Building.

Work on this building will go forward as quickly as the remaining funds are available. This means that the solicitation should be carried on with utmost speed.

In a short time, before June 30, 1951, Texas Christian University hopes to be able to present the need for building funds with which to complete the School of Religion structure. Mr. Carr has given the movement a very splendid beginning. Others will wish to see this program through to a successful conclusion.

Here is a challenge of magnitude.

Here is a splendid opportunity to set up a memorial for someone.

The education of ministers and Christian leaders is a timely and worthwhile program in which to invest.

This project needs other persons who have also a reputation for doing things on a large scale.

A Christian steward should wish no finer cause in which to dedicate gifts.
