Koehler to attend his last TCU graduation event

The spring 2004 graduation marks the end of a 35-year legacy at TCU.

Provost William Koehler, who started his career at TCU in 1969 as an associate professor of chemistry and has attended graduations ever since, will retire at the end of May to pursue the presidency of the Fort Worth school board.

Koehler said he enjoys graduation due to the celebratory nature of the event.

"It's such a neat time for parents and students," Koehler said.

His main role in the graduation ceremony is to keep everything under control, which is not always an easy task.

One year a young man approached the stage wearing his robe, hat, shoes and nothing else, and then flashed the audience, Koehler said.

The nurses always do something collectively, such as release balloons, Koehler said.

"Nurses are always making a spectacle of themselves," Koehler said.

Besides worrying about the students, Koehler also has to concern himself with issues such as a no-show speaker.

"We always keep a few words in our coat pocket just in case," Koehler said.

During the ceremony, Koehler also calls out degree titles, follows the reading of names to ensure students receive their personal diploma and sings the alma mater at the closing.

Koehler said this graduation event will be very similar to what he first experienced 35 years ago.

"It has moved to a larger facility and a reception has been added, but otherwise the ceremony has not changed over the years, and I applaud them for that," Koehler said. "The event is really ceremonial and traditional."

Afterwards, while the students and families go out to celebrate, Koehler said he tries to get home and out of his robe in time to enjoy the rest of the evening with his family.

While Koehler said he tries not to think in terms of this being his last graduation, the faculty and staff lament the departure of a great friend, teacher and administrator.

"It is the end of an era, but I anticipate that (Koehler) will continue to be of service to the university and the community at large," said John

Albright, who was a part of the chemistry department when Koehler arrived at TCU.

Manfred Reinecke, a professor of chemistry, described Koehler as an excellent teacher, a gourmet cook and a strong supporter of excellence at TCU.

"He will be hard to replace, but I wish him success in cleaning up the mess in the Fort Worth Independent School District," Reinecke said.

Chemistry professor William Watson said he imagines Koehler has mixed emotions about this being his last graduation year and graduation, and will miss having the opportunity to contribute to the continued development of the university.

"There is some relief in not having to worry about the annual problems of budget, curriculum, faculty and continual development of goals and priorities," Watson said.


Koehler agreed and said he tries not to think about leaving TCU.

"I will not let myself become melancholy," Koehler said.

Koehler's official last day will be May 31. From the May 8 graduation until then, he will be spending a lot of time with Provost-Designate Nowell Donovan.

"I will start off the May-semester and deal with any issues that arise out of that," Koehler said.

Commencement may fill the Convention Center

The 2004 May graduation should prove to have the highest attendance numbers in university history, in addition to some unique events during the ceremony.

Margaret Kelly, director of special projects, helps to organize graduation every year. She said this year should go as beautifully as every year, and there will be some special goings-on for the Commencement Ceremony.

Kelly said the first group of Community Scholars will graduate this May, and an honorary Doctorate of Humanitarian Services will be awarded posthumously to Laura Lee Crane. Crane, a retired TCU professor, was killed earlier this year.

Chancellor Victor Boschini will attend his first May commencement

at TCU this year. He remembers his own graduation as bittersweet, but he hopes it's a joyous time for all the spring graduates.

"I always love graduation, because it's such a happy time," Boschini said. "Everyone is so happy: students, parents, faculty."

"I hope it's a wonderful beginning, not an end," he said. "I hope it's the beginning of a new phase in their relationship with TCU and life-long learning."

This is the third year the commencement ceremony will be held in the Fort Worth Convention Center, Kelly said.

"Students said it was more important to have all their family and friends there than to have it on campus," she said.

Julie Dozier will be graduating with a fashion-promotion major and an art history minor. She said she didn't understand at first why the graduation was being held downtown, but now she thinks it is a better choice than holding it on campus.

"There's a legitimate reason to

hold it there because it's bigger and there's better parking and the Fort Worth police can take care of everything," she said. "But it would be nice to have it on campus because your whole life has been on campus for the past four years."

Sarah Cox, an advertising/public relations major, said, "Having it downtown actually helps me because I'm having my graduation party downtown and there are hotels for my family to stay in."

One thing Cox is not looking forward to is the length of the ceremony.

"It's supposed to take a lot of time to call everyone's name," she said.

The convention center holds approximately 10,400 people, Kelly said, and there are usually 10 guests attending for each student.

"We will be at capacity," she said.

This year may be outstanding if more

people attend than the 2003 graduation, which was the largest to date, Kelly said.

"When you have about 1,000 students and each one has 10 guests, that puts you right at the limit," she said.

Pam Sanguinet, manager of academic progress services, said she estimated the number of graduation candidates for May, there are an expected 932 bachelor's degrees, 211 master's degrees, 1 doctorate of ministry, and 9 Ph.D.s to be handed out.

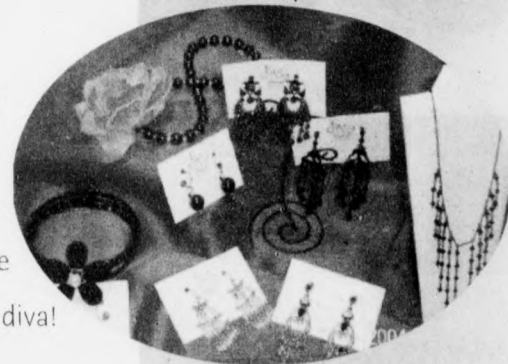

Professor Laura Lee Crane to be honored at Commencement

Commencement is a time for students to celebrate the start of new beginnings, but this semester's commencement will also celebrate the life of someone who gave students a place for new beginnings.

Laura Lee Crane had a profound impact upon the lives of many children and families through her work at Starpoint, Provost William Koehler said.

Crane was the director of the Starpoint School from 1969 until her retirement in 1990 and was also a

professor of education.

"She was an individual who developed Starpoint into one of the premier learning settings in the country," Koehler said. "Under her leadership, Starpoint became a model for assisting students with learning disabilities."

"I was always struck by her grace and inner strength that she possessed," Koehler said.

Crane, 77, was abducted from a Fort Worth grocery store parking lot on Jan. 30. Crane's body was found five days later in southern Oklahoma.

Two Fort Worth residents, Edward

Busby, 31, and Kathleen Latimer, 39, have been linked to her disappearance and charged with capital murder.

Robin Davis, a teacher at Starpoint and a former student of Crane, said Crane was always gracious, poised and interested about people.

"She would make you feel like you were the only person in the room," Davis said. Crane always gave her undivided attention and would talk you through any kind of problem you might have.

"One of the reasons I am still here is to carry on her dreams and

philosophies at Starpoint," Davis said.

"I owe everything I know about teaching to her," Davis said. "She taught me that every student can learn no matter what difficulties they may have. You find a way to teach them."

The honorary diploma will be presented to Laura Lee Crane's daughter, Allen Walker, during the commencement ceremony May 8. Crane was chosen by the Board of Trustees to receive the diploma.

Laura Miller, a member of the TCU Board of Trustees, said, "Obviously, we are thrilled to honor such

a fine person, posthumously, who touched the lives of so many."

Koehler said Crane's impact on Starpoint and TCU will never be forgotten.

"She was a difference maker in the lives of hundreds of thousands of young people," Koehler said.

Crane was a remarkable and inspirational teacher and friend, Davis said. There is nobody else who deserves this award more.

"She was beautiful inside and out," Davis said. "There will never be anyone else like Laura Lee."
