Hewatt Accused Of Murder

Prof Willis Hewatt has been charged with murdering nine people in the biology lab yesterday.

He was last seen with the nine people an hour before the bodies were discovered. The mangled condition of the bodies made it impossible for them to be identified.

Mrs. Hewatt was in a bereaved condition and their children will probably be sent to an orphan's home. Mrs. Hewatt stated that she would start taking in washing to pay for the best lawyers in the country to defend her husband. The damaging evidence against her husband has not lessened her trust in him.

President E. M. Waits said that under the conditions school would have to be dismissed for the remainder of the year. Full credit will be given in all classes, however. The president said that he regretted the incident and that the flag would remain at half mast for the rest of the school year.

The parents of the massacred students have taken up a petition to burn T. C. U. to the ground for the tragedy and preparing to hang Prof. Hewatt themselves if the courts find him guilty.

Prof. Hewatt was released yesterday on a bond of friendship and refused an interview with reporters who swarmed around his house.

Dr. Gayle Scott and Dr. W. M. Winton are to be the chief witnesses for the plaintiff. The lawyer for this side is said to have a surprise witness who will appear at this trial.

The lawyer for the defense is valiantly trying to uncover clues that will lead to further evidence in the case.

It is believed that the nine people murdered belong to that famous family, Pussy Cat.


Flash—Dr. Alphasheus Field-Marshall, renowned lecturer, holds class without bringing his book.
