

Atlanta Aug. 15th 1864

Dear Sister

I am at the 7th on a visit for the purpose of seeing Col. Moody - he wrote me a note yesterday evening stating that Robt. & Button had crossed the river with him but had been separated from them - he says that Button was a little sick & Robt. was waiting him - he says that they will be on in a few days. I am anxious to see them. I shall try to get Robt with a co of Scouts. They were in Miss. when we left them. I see we are all safe yet we have had a good deal of fighting & several men killed or wounded though none of our co. our chaplain was serious if not mortally wounded while tending the wounded - We were after a raid commanded by Meade of about 3,000 men, we captured about 1,200 men & 11-00 to 1,200 horses & 2 ambulances & 2 pieces of artillery - I see if you can let the friends of Co G, know how they are getting on - I might write you a long letter but I haven't the time - Give my love to all the family & relations & all inquiring friends
