Green Honors Professors to discuss math and Internet crime

THE FIRST PART OF MARCH will bring two distinguished lecturers to campus as part of the Green Honors Professors program. The Department of Mathematics will host Dr. Ronald Graham, director of the applied mathematics division of AT&T Bell Labs, and the Department of Computer Science will host Dr. Eugene Spafford, associate professor of computer science at Purdue University.

While at TCU, Dr. Graham will give four presentations. On March 4 at 4 p.m., he will discuss "Combinatorics and Computers." On March 5, he will present "Juggling Drops and Descents" at 4 p.m. and "Searching for the Shortest Network" at 7:30 p.m. His final presentation, "Arithmetic Progression: Past, Present and Future," will be at 3:30 p.m. March 6. All of Dr. Graham's afternoon talks will be in Winton-Scott Hall, Room 145. The Tuesday evening lecture will be held in Sid Richardson, Lecture Hall 2.

Dr. Graham is one of the world's most distinguished mathematicians and is currently president of the American Mathematical Society. He has won some of the most prestigious prizes in science, including the George Polya Prize and the Scientist of the Year Award from *World Book Encyclopedia*. Dr. Graham also is an expert on the Rubik's Cube and is past president of the International Jugglers Association.

Dr. Spafford is a noted researcher and developer in computer science and co-authored the award-winning book, "Practical UNIX Security." His other works include an analysis of computer viruses published in 1989.

Dr. Spafford is founder and director of the COAST (Computer Operations Audit and Security Technology) project, an ongoing collaborative effort to develop workable

The event, co-sponsored by University Ministries, TCU Hunger Week and the Department of Journalism, will also be a fund-raising benefit for Mother Teresa's orphanages in India and the Church of South India Leprosy Mission.

Violin recital to feature RetroFest-era works

A MARCH 4 RECITAL by TCU faculty violinist Barbara Barber and pianist Jill Sprenger will feature a diverse group of works either written or arranged between 1911 and 1920. The event is part of Tandy RetroFest '96, a three-month celebration of the 20th century's second decade.

The solo recital is the first Barbara has performed since becoming a full-time TCU faculty member last fall. She will play Respighi's 1919 piano realization of Vivaldi's "Sonata in D," Ives' 1916 work "Children's Day at the Camp Meeting," Debussy's 1917 piece "Sonata for Violin and Piano," Rachmaninoff's 1912 "Vocalise, Op. 34, No. 14," and Bartók's 1915 "Rumanian Folk Dances."

The recital is free and open to the public and will begin at 7:30 p.m. in Ed Landreth Auditorium. For more information, contact the music department at Ext. 7602. ♦

Barbara Jordan exhibit on view in library lobby

STAFF AT THE Mary Coats Burnett Library have assembled an exhibit case featuring Barbara Jordan's life and accomplishments.

Jordan was the first woman in the Texas Senate and the first African-American in the Texas Senate since 1883. She was the first Southern black woman in the U.S. House of Representatives and in 1976, became the first black woman to speak at a National Democratic Convention.

The exhibit is part of TCU's Black History Month observance. It displays photos and articles summarizing Jordan's major accomplishments, and will be on view through March 15. ♦
