Summertime is hectic for conference services and orientation office

YOU KNOW IT'S SUMMER AT TCU when ... squads of middle school cheerleaders are performing under the trees ... tables in the The Main are occupied by young ballet dancers ... hoards of soccer kids swarm across the parking lot as you're searching for an empty spot. It's just not the same campus between May and July.

That's because these are the heaviest months for conferences, camps and special events that attract outside guests to campus, according to Debbie Zihlman, director of conference services. This year, her figures show that the TCU community can anticipate sharing the campus with a whopping 78,424 visitors.

That figure represents 9,636 youths, 1,270 adults and a group of 67,518 that is a mix of the two. There have been seven school banquets and proms held on campus, 10 graduation ceremonies (nine high schools plus Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary's commencement), 30 youth sports camps, 13 educational/leadership camps for youth, seven cheer camps, five church camps, 18 fine arts camps/workshops, three sorority reunions and three professional workshops.

In addition to outside groups, TCU hosted five freshman orientation sessions during June, plus another for transfer students. According to Rene Benson, manager of the orientation office, a total of 1,038 freshman came to campus for orientation and 95% of those brought family members. Transfer orientation attracted an additional 57 students. •

Police lost and found to be updated, computerized

EYEGLASSES, CAR AND DORM KEYS, bicycles, sunglasses, VCRs, wallets and books. All of these items have at one time or another found a way to the lost and found facility maintained by the TCU police. Those unclaimed have remained on shelves and in boxes indefinitely, until now.

The lost and found is being updated, organized and computerized, says Detective Kelly Ham. A property room has been set aside and a computerized inventory will be kept of its contents. Police computer equipment has been enhanced with a lost and found system, to be implemented this week.

TCU police are also examining options for moving old items out of lost and found. Possibilities include turning the numerous schoolbooks over to the library and auctioning off property that has been on hand more than a year. Any money made from the removal of items will be given to non-profit organizations.

Campus police officers are sometimes amazed at the mass of unclaimed belongings, according to Kelly. "Even when we find a wallet, contact the owner and let him know we have it, we still only have about one out of five wallets claimed," he says.
