FEMALE FACULTY AND STAFF, AGES 35 and above, are invited to take advantage of services provided by the M.D. Anderson Cancer Network Mobile Mammogram Unit during its two-day visit to TCU.

Hours are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Dec. 11 and Dec. 15 when the van will be located behind the human resources office.

A screening mammogram is a low dose x-ray of the breast, proven effective in the early detection of breast cancer, when it is most curable.

Women who have no known breast problems, do not have breast implants or are not pregnant or breast-feeding are eligible for this service.

Call the Doris Kupferle Breast Center at 820-4800 to make an appointment. The procedure is covered by medical insurance, however, those without insurance coverage will be accommodated.
