## Printing services will move to Student Center; retail copy shop opening

IT'LL SOON BE A NEW WORLD FOR THE staff in printing services...and their customers as well.

By mid-July, printing services will be relocated to the basement level at the north end of the Student Center...around the corner from the old Bookstore and down one floor via elevator.

**Glen Bradford** (manager, printing services) estimates the department will have at least an additional 1,000 square feet of work space. The area, once used as textbook storage for the bookstore, has undergone some techno-redesign that provides a professional look and a glass storefront entry.

Glen says there will be three distinct areas – one for production, a customer service counter and the convenience copier. He notes that the actual move is planned to minimize disruption of printing service. "I don't anticipate we'll be down more than a half day, if at all," he says, explaining that the presses will be moved on a Saturday.

He plans to send an all-campus email to announce the exact dates of the move.

Printing also has announced an exciting retail venture, scheduled to open in early August down the hall from its new facility. Called Frog Prints, it will be a copy shop tailored to the needs of students in the same way a Kinko's or Alphagraphics store serves consumers. Frog Prints comes in response to the recent Student Center survey conducted on campus.

According to Glen, there will be two walk-up copiers that operate with coins or by card. Customers also can submit jobs at a service counter and either wait for it to be completed or return to pick it up later. There also will be a color copier available at this location.

## Chamber music concerts upcoming at PepsiCo Hall

VIOLINIST CURT THOMPSON (MUSIC) has organized the second annual Mimir Chamber Music Festival for mid-July on campus. A part of the TCU Summer Music Institute, the festival includes performances at 7:30 p.m. July 13, July 15 and July 16 in PepsiCo Recital Hall.

Mimir (ME'mir) is a six-piece ensemble of artists/faculty, including members of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and the Cleveland Orchestra; faculty of the TCU School of Music and UNT College of Music; concert and recording artists from Sweden including clarinetist Martin Frost, a Grammy Award nominee. According to Curt, it is rare that an ensemble of such high-caliber chamber musicians has been in residence in the Metroplex for the purpose of promoting community awareness and participation in chamber music performance.

Tickets for the chamber music concerts will be \$5 for those with TCU IDs and seniors, \$8 for adults. Children under 12 will be admitted free.

The concerts are made possible through the generosity of the Texas Swedish Cultural Foundation, the Swedish Council of America, the TCU Summer Music Institute and the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram*. Additional support for the festival comes from the Amateur Chamber Music Players and the Clinton B. Ford fund of its ACMP Foundation, an organization that promotes chamber music activities for amateur musicians. ♦
