## More than 450 expected here Wednesday to kick off *The Commission on the Future*

THE COMMISSION ON THE FUTURE OF TCU begins its year-long work Wednesday when the 452-member group convenes for the first time on campus. The kickoff begins with a lunch buffet at 11:30 a.m. in the Student Center ballroom, featuring remarks by CBS news anchor Bob Schieffer, chairman of *The Commission*.

Other speakers include **Chancellor Michael R. Ferrari**; **Larry Lauer**, associate vice chancellor for communications and public affairs and the director of *The Commission*; the **Rev. John L. Butler**, minister to the University; John Roach, chair of the TCU Board of Trustees; and **Bill Moncrief**, interim dean of the M.J. Neeley School of Business.

At 2:30 p.m., members of *The Commission* will meet with the Task Force groups to which they've been assigned. Their goal is to determine TCU's course for the coming century by focusing on 17 specific areas of the University.

Dr. Galbraith, who formerly served in Congress as executive director of the Joint Economic Committee, is currently national chairman of the Economists' Committee for a Decent Minimum Wage. His latest book *Created Unequal: The Crisis in American Pay* demonstrates his commitment to instituting fair pay for all.

Dr. Galbraith received his B.A. degree from Harvard University and his doctoral degree in economics from Yale University. Outside his teaching commitments, Galbraith serves as a senior scholar for the Jerome Levy Economics Institute, chair for the Economists Allied for Arms Reduction, and a columnist for *Texas Observer*. ♦
