Interior design students to display ideas for renovating Jarvis Hall

STUDENTS IN FRED OBERKIRCHER'S senior interior design class had a big job on their hands last fall...a complete overhaul of 89-year-old Jarvis Hall. It was all done on paper, of course, but the results of their semester-long assignment will soon be displayed for the entire campus community to see.

An exhibition, set for Feb. 11-16 in the Student Center lounge, will include design development, computer-generated drawings and sample boards representing ideas for both interior finishes and furniture. Since the class was divided into four design teams, there are four very different approaches to the renovation.

Fred's advanced class always has a senior project of this magnitude...a school, hospital, nursing home, etc. The idea of a Cinderella makeover for a residence hall came out of a casual conversation between Fred and Roger Fisher (residential services). Jarvis, the oldest dormitory on campus, fit the bill because it is small enough for the class to study the entire building.

"As a treasured part of TCU's history, any future renovation of this residence hall needed a careful and sympathetic analysis," says Fred. Students surveyed the current residents, interviewed the staff of residential services and conducted a "post-occupancy" survey of TCU's newest living facilities. TCU architect Larry Garrison and professional designers working on the current Foster Hall renovation agreed to be part of the project by reviewing the students' work and lending their expertise.

The "final exam" consisted of each team making an hour-long presentation to TCU administrators, consultants and interested students on Dec. 16. ♦
