Philosophers will meet on campus later this week

THE PHILOSOPHY DEPARTMENT WILL host the 23rd annual Workshop in Ancient Philosophy March 23-25 at the Dee J. Kelly Alumni & Visitors Center. Plato and Aristotle will be the focus of this year's conference.

The event, co-sponsored by the departments of philosophy and classics at the University of Texas (Austin) each year attracts preeminent scholars of ancient philosophy from around the nation.

All lectures are open to the public. Keynote speakers are Terry Penner from the University of Wisconsin who will discuss fallacies of relevance in Plato's Republic, and Russell Dancy of Florida State University who will speak on later developments in Plato's metaphysics.
