Chancellor Ferrari will address University Convocation next Tuesday

CHANCELLOR MICHAEL R. FERRARI WILL deliver his annual State of the University address which outlines initiatives for the coming year during Convocation at 11 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 12 in Ed Landreth Auditorium. Faculty and administrators in full regalia will lead the colorful procession.

Chancellor Ferrari also will present the Chancellor's Award for Distinguished Teaching.

Nominees are eight faculty members who have already received their School and College awards this year: Gregg E. Franzwa (humanities), Rhonda L. Hatcher (natural sciences) and Linda S. Moore (social sciences), all of AddRan College; Stanley B. Block of Neeley School; Susan E. Anderson of the School of Education; Blaise J. Ferrandino of the College of Fine Arts; Lynn K. Flahive of the College of Communication and Susan Wilson of the College of Health and Human Sciences.

The Wassenich Award for Mentoring in the TCU Community will be presented to a member of the faculty or staff in recognition and celebration of this person's mentoring of students. The honor was created in 1999 through an endowment established by TCU alumni Mark and Linda Wassenich of Dallas. Because of their own rich experiences as TCU students, the couple founded the unique mentoring award to highlight the value TCU places on key relationships with faculty and staff which help students develop, succeed and contribute to their communities.

This year's finalists are: Phyllis Bodie (Student Center), Nadia Lahutsky (religion), Phil Hartman (biology) and Mary Martin Patton (education).

University organist Joe Butler will play and the Concert Chorale will perform, under the direction of Ronald Shirey. Richard Estes will lead the singing of the alma mater; University minister John L. Butler will deliver the invocation and the benediction. Provost Bill Koehler will introduce the awards.

As long as offices are covered, all faculty, staff and students are encouraged to attend.

Celebration on the Lawn will begin as soon as Convocation lets out, on Reed Hall lawn, with party tents and refreshments. Music will be provided by the TCU Jazz Ensemble, under the direction of **Curt Wilson**.

faculty, students and all staff members to kick off TCU's 128th year together in an informal, festive atmosphere. In the event of rain, it will be moved to the Student Center ballroom.

Doris Kearns Goodwin will speak at Fogelson Honors Forum in October

WRITER/HISTORIAN DORIS KEARNS Goodwin, celebrated for her expertise on both presidential politics and baseball, will be the featured guest at this year's Fogelson Honors Forum. She will speak on "The Essence of Leadership" at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 25 in Ed Landreth Auditorium.

The event is free and open to the public, although seat reservations are necessary. These will become available around Oct. 11 through David Connally (honors) at ext. 6488. According to David, anyone with a ticket will be guaranteed a seat until 7:45 p.m. the night of the lecture. After that time, all available seating will be open to anyone, first come, first served.

A former Woodrow Wilson Fellow and Harvard government professor, Goodwin published her first book, Lyndon Johnson & The American Dream, in 1976. The Fitzgeralds & The Kennedys came out in 1987 and, in 1995, she was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in history for No Ordinary Time: Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt: The American Home Front During World War II. Her most recent work is Wait Till Next Year: A Memoir which explores her childhood affinity for the Brooklyn Dodgers.

Goodwin is a regular panelist on PBS' The News Hour with Jim Lehrer and as a commentator for NBC. She was consultant and on-air person for PBS documentaries on LBJ, the Kennedy family, Franklin Roosevelt and Ken Burns' The History of Baseball. She is married to the writer Richard Goodwin who worked in the White House under both Kennedy and Johnson. His experience as the investigator who uncovered the quiz show scandals of the 1950s was explored in the Academy Award-nominated film Quiz Show.
