Dick Hoban accepts new responsibilities in finance; position effective Jan. 1

VICE CHANCELLOR FOR FINANCE AND Business Carol Campbell announces that Dick Hoban has consented to take up the position of Assistant Treasurer on a full-time basis beginning Jan. 1, 2001.

The move will allow Finance and Business to better focus on key functions including investment and endowment reporting, banking relations, debt management, cash forecasting and cash management. In his new role, Dick will be responsible for developing web-based cash receipting systems and new cash payment processes to better serve the needs of TCU offices and departments, and to keep pace with the rapid advances in e-commerce.

Dick has also agreed to continue his responsibilities as budget systems coordinator. Remaining responsibilities and duties, including those relating to financial services, will be assigned to a new position designated as University Controller. A national search to fill this position will commence immediately.

"Please join me in congratulating Dick on his new responsibilities and thanking him for extraordinary dedication to TCU as he has filled multiple roles for an extended period of time," Carol said. ♦

TCU phones already set to handle 10-digit dialing, says business services

BEGINNING OCT. 7, A NEW 682 AREA code will overlay Fort Worth's existing 817 designation. This means that all new phone numbers will be under the 682 area code.

It also means the beginning of 10-digit dialing for anyone placing local phone calls, according to **Darlene Housewright** (business services). Fortunately for the TCU community, the telecommunications department on campus has already programmed the TCU phone system to accommodate dialing either 7 or 10 digits within the 817 local calling area.

Darlene explains that you do not need to reprogram your office phones for outgoing calls, including fax machines and modems. You will need to change speed dials on cell phones and home modems in order to dial into TCU. ♦
