Hollywood screenwriter visiting Thursday as Green Chair for English

WILLIAM HARRISON, NOVELIST, Hollywood screenplay writer and a TCU alumnus, will give a public reading of a new, unpublished short story at the Creative Writing Contest awards at 2 p.m. Thursday at the Kelly Center.

His apppearance on campus is hosted by the English department, in conjunction with the Green Honors program.

A Dallas native, Harrison enrolled at TCU as a freshman in 1951 and majored in journalism and religion. He was editor of *The Skiff* in 1954-1955 and earned an M.A. degree in English.

In 1964, Harrison began his long

association with the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville as founder of the Creative Writing Program there. He retired from the university in 1998.

Harrison is the author of eight novels, two collections of short fiction, three produced screenplays and numerous travel and non-fiction essays. He is best known for the historical novel *Burton and Speeke*, which became the film *Mountains of the Moon*.
