## Linda Moore appointed associate dean of College of Health and Human Sciences

LINDA MOORE, FORMER CHAIR OF TCU's social work department, has been assigned a new position as associate dean of TCU's College of Health and Human Sciences. Moore, who has taught at TCU for almost 25 years, will begin her new duties this month.

As associate dean, Moore will ensure students pursuing degrees within the college choose appropriate academic courses to achieve desired degree plans. Last year, approximately 530 students pursued degrees in the college which houses the departments of social work, communication sciences and disorders, and kinesiology, as well as the Harris School of Nursing.

Tracy Deitz, an associate professor of social work, will assume duties as chair of the department of social work. ♦

## CTAEC hires new director: Growth projected as center develops new programs

A FORMER DIRECTOR OF PRICE Waterhouse Coopers' strategic change unit has been named director of the Neeley School of Business' Charles Tandy American Enterprise Center (CTAEC). William R. Bigler Jr., who has provided strategic solutions for companies in industries such as finance, manufacturing, retail, real estate and health care, assumed duties of the center in May after Jack Barrett, CTAEC director for 10 years, retired.

Bigler will continue to develop CTAEC's signature management development courses and begin to establish new programs that will include expert panels and commissioned studies. Expert panels would be used to guide top-level business managers through tough decisions that could impact the business, such as whether or not a Web site would disrupt land sales. Commissioned studies would consist of faculty members conducting research on how current trends, like labor shortages, could affect businesses in the near or distant future.

"Our goal is for CTAEC to offer objective, high-quality programs and services at superior value for businesses seeking ways to improve or increase their performance," said Bigler.

Another new approach CTAEC will use this year is a diagnostic assessment tool to assist in the development of comprehensive, custom-designed management curricula for clients. ♦

## Nursing launches fast-track master's degree online

HARRIS SCHOOL OF NURSING IS launching an online master of science in nursing degree this fall that will fast-track associate- and bachelor-degreed nurses through their master's degree and equip

them to function autonomously within a variety of health care settings. The online component will allow hospitals and other health care employers to gain a more qualified workforce without losing crucial manpower.

The MSN degree program, which

consists of a three-year track for associate-level nurses and a two-year track for those with bachelor degrees, will prepare students to become clinical nurse specialists in adult health nursing. Associate-degreed nurses will complete undergraduate coursework during the first year of study, then spend the remaining two years on their master's degree.

While most of the work for the degree will be conducted online, students will be required to complete 500 hours of clinical work in health care settings located near their residence.

## Richard Allen wins Daytime Emmy for writing

**RICHARD ALLEN**, ASSOCIATE professor of radio-TV-film and a writer for CBS' *As the World Turns*, has added another title to his credentials — Emmy winner. *As the World Turns* won the Daytime Emmy for Outstanding Drama Series Writing Team at the recent 2000/2001 Daytime Emmy Awards.

Allen and his family weren't even watching the awards show. Instead, they were celebrating the beginning of Sabbath at their temple, where Richard's wife, Sheri, is a cantorial soloist.

"We came home to lots of phone messages informing us we'd won," said Allen. "It was exciting, especially since I had written dialogue for several of the entries, including the writing award."

Allen had been nominated once before for a Daytime Emmy in 1987 for his writing on *Days of Our Lives*. He also has written for *One Life to Live*, *General Hospital* and *Another World*. Allen has taught at TCU for eight years. ♦
