## Rising piano stars, music teachers, amateurs here for TCU/Cliburn Institute

INSPIRING THE YOUNG AND HOPEFUL. Stimulating the longtime teacher. Affirming the amateur. Each year, the TCU/Cliburn Piano Institute invites students like these to immerse themselves in the study of piano performance, technique and repertoire with world-class professionals.

The Institute unfolds on campus every summer, and is in session now through June 30. This year's crop of piano talent includes more than 80 musicians who will perform and many more who are here just to listen to the others. There are 21 young artists selected by audition from the major music conservatories of the world and another 10 attending on their own, 20 piano teachers from across the country and 33 amateurs from as far away as Germany and England.

Founded in 1981 by **Tamás Ungár** (School of Music), the Institute is a cooperative venture between TCU and the Cliburn Foundation which presents the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in Fort Worth every four years. Tamás continues to organize and oversee the Institute's three-faceted program. "The standard is very high this year," he says, noting that the audition tapes sent by the aspiring professional pianists are "the highest level of performance the jury has ever heard here."

Private lessons and master classes, taught by a distinguished faculty of international pianists, teachers, conductors and composers, are at the heart of the three-week Young Artists Program. The Institute is opened to the community through various piano concerts on campus and master classes which may be audited. This month, master pianists (who double as Institute faculty) will perform solo concerts in PepsiCo Recital Hall. Tickets, \$20 for general admission and \$15 for senior citizens, are available through Central Ticket Office at 817-335-9000.

The Young Artist Concerto Concerts, perhaps the most singular aspect of the Institute, offers the most promising young students a chance to perform with the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra. Those events are set for 5 p.m. Sunday, June 23 in Ed Landreth Auditorium (Maestro Yens Georg Bachman conducting) and at 5 p.m. Sunday, June 30 in Ed Landreth Auditorium (Maestro Eduardo Browne conducting). Ticket information is the

same as for the piano concerts listed above. A new incentive this year will be the awarding of cash prizes to first-, second- and third-place winners, selected by the audience.

Three-hour master classes are scheduled daily from now until June 30 in PepsiCo Recital Hall (check the Institute Web site at [www.tcu-cliburn.org](http://www.tcu-cliburn.org) for participating faculty and times, as well as all program details). General admission, payable at the door, is \$7, \$5 for senior citizens, teachers and students.

Free musical events also are part of the schedule. Each of the young pianists enrolled in the Institute will perform during recitals set for 8 p.m. tonight, June 19, 20, 24 and 29 in PepsiCo Recital Hall. ♦

## High school writers due on campus for English Dept. workshop

TWENTY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS have been accepted into the TCU English Department's second summer writing workshop, co-sponsored by The Larry McMurtry Center for the Arts & Humanities of Archer City. Participants, identified as gifted and talented young writers, are coming from all parts of Texas for enrichment programs in poetry, fiction, drama and non-fiction. English faculty leading the sessions include **Steve Sherwood**, **Cara Diaconoff** and **Thomas Pfau**. **Marie Schein** is director of the on-campus segment of the program.

The workshop, set for June 16-29, opens with a week in Archer City that includes a personal visit with Pulitzer Prize-winning novelist Larry McMurtry. The students will spend the second week on the TCU campus.

A highlight of their time here will be a talk by Skip Hollandsworth, a TCU alumnus and former newspaper reporter and columnist who is on the staff of *Texas Monthly* magazine.

He will speak from 7-9 p.m. June 25 at the Kelly Center. The event is free and open to the public.
