## Chancellor Ferrari will present awards at University Convocation next week

**CHANCELLOR MICHAEL R. FERRARI** WILL DELIVER his annual State of the University address which outlines initiatives for the coming year during Convocation at 11 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 12 in Ed Landreth Auditorium. Faculty and administrators in full regalia will lead the colorful procession.

Chancellor Ferrari also will present the Chancellor's Award for Distinguished Teaching.

Nominees are eight faculty members who have already received their School and College awards this year: **C. David Grant** (AddRan College/Humanities), **Donald W. Jackson** (AddRan College/Social Sciences), **Stanley B. Block** (M.J. Neeley School of Business), **Joan McGettigan** (College of Communication), **Elizabeth R. Taylor** (School of Education), **Michael Lee Niblett** (College of Fine Arts), **Susan Weeks** (College of Health and Human Sciences) and **John A. Breyer** (College of Science and Engineering).

The Wassenich Award for Mentoring in the TCU Community will be presented to a member of the faculty or staff in recognition and celebration of this person's mentoring of students. The honor was created in 1999 through an endowment established by TCU alumni Mark and Linda Wassenich of Dallas. Because of their own rich experiences as TCU students, the couple founded the unique

mentoring award to highlight the value TCU places on key relationships with faculty and staff which help students develop, succeed and contribute to their communities.

This year's finalists are: **Kay Higgins** (student development services), **Yumiko Keltges** (modern languages), **Leo Newland** (geology) and **Jack Raskopf** (journalism).

University organist **Joe Butler** will play and the Concert Chorale will perform, under the direction of **Ronald Shirey**. **Richard Estes** will lead the singing of the alma mater; University minister **John L. Butler** will deliver the invocation and the benediction. **Provost Bill Koehler** will introduce the awards.

As long as offices are covered, all faculty, staff and students are encouraged to attend.

Celebration on the Lawn will begin as soon as Convocation lets out, on the lawn between Sadler and Reed Halls, with party tents and refreshments. Music will be provided by the TCU Jazz Combo.

The celebration offers an opportunity for faculty, students and all staff members to kick off TCU's 130th year together in an informal, festive atmosphere. In the event of rain, it will be moved to the Student Center ballroom. ♦

## Campus to mark Day of Caring and Remembrance on 9/11 anniversary

THE CARILLON AT ROBERT CARR CHAPEL will ring at 7:46 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 11 as part of a citywide bell chorus, marking the moment the first tower was struck at the World Trade Center one year ago. This is just one way TCU is supporting the United Way's Day of Caring and Remembrance, part of the national initiative *Participate America*.

A bus will depart from the Student Center at 11:15 a.m. to transport members of the TCU community downtown to Sundance Square for the United Way's noontime ceremony featuring Judge Tom Vandergriff and Anita Foster of the American Red Cross, Chisholm Trail Chapter. The bus will return to campus at 1 p.m.

The TCU Reading Frogs (Staff Assembly)

will support the Day of Caring and Remembrance by volunteering in local elementary schools. Volunteers will read a picture book, *America the Beautiful*, to children in pre-kindergarten and kindergarten classes throughout the Fort Worth ISD. They also will lead a brief, scripted discussion focusing on pride in our country.

Additionally, the Programming Council of the Student Government Association invites the campus together as a Community of Hope at 8:30 p.m. on Sept. 11. The evening ceremony will feature remarks from **Chancellor Michael Ferrari**, **Rev. John Butler**, Chelsea Hudson, SGA president, and Maria Frederiksen,
