Trustees honor Chancellor Ferrari at board meeting

JOHN V. ROACH, CHAIRMAN OF THE TCU Board of Trustees, has announced the creation of the Michael R. Ferrari Award for Distinguished University Service & Leadership as part of the activities surrounding the board's annual meeting.

"This award will be given annually to recognize the exemplary leadership he gave to TCU and the city of Fort Worth, as well as his ability to inspire others to lead when and where the situation calls for it at all levels of the institution," Roach said.

The award, which carries a \$5,000 prize, will be given to a TCU faculty or staff member who provides leadership for finding a solution to a significant problem, manages an important project, designs a creative new initiative or reaches out to improve the university or surrounding community.

Fort Worth Mayor Kenneth Barr, a 1964 graduate of TCU, presented a city proclamation declaring April 10, 2003 Chancellor Michael R. Ferrari Day in Fort Worth.

In his final report to the board, Chancellor Ferrari reviewed fall admissions, citing another record number of applications (7,565 as of April 11) and a 54% increase in applications from minority students (1,786 currently vs. 1,161 at this time last year). He also reassured the board of the university's ongoing review of emergency preparedness procedures and policies, and asked **Larry Lauer** (vice chancellor, marketing and communication) to update the board on the impact of the state's current budget discussions on the Tuition and Equalization Grant (TEG) program, a need-based program that grants qualified students up to \$3,500 if they choose to attend a private college or university in Texas. The program is expected to be cut anywhere from 12.5% to 20%, Lauer reported, impacting significantly the 1,533 TCU students who receive a total of approximately \$4.1 million in TEG grants from the state.

In other business, the board:

■ Elected **Spencer Hayes** of Nashville, a 1959 graduate of TCU who has served on the board since 1987, to Emeritus Trustee; elected **Mary Ralph Lowe**, CEO of Maralo, an oil and gas company, and benefactor of the Erma and Ralph Lowe Chair of Texas History at TCU, to a four-year term as trustee ending 2007; and re-elected 11 trustees of the Class of 2003 to four-year terms ending 2007.

■ Authorized the administration to petition to zone property owned by TCU generally bounded by University, Berry, McCart and

Cantey to MU2 status, and to issue requests for proposals for private development plans on certain properties owned by the university. ♦
