Chancellor Boschini arrives; will spend summer settling in to Fort Worth, Sadler Hall

TODAY DAWNED ON A NEW ERA IN TCU'S 130-year history ... a campus community under the leadership of **Dr. Victor J. Boschini Jr.** He and his family arrived in town yesterday, having driven from Normal, IL, where he has been president of Illinois State University.

The moving van is being unloaded at the Chancellor's residence at 3861 Bellaire Circle, and tomorrow Dr. Boschini's office routine in Sadler Hall will begin in earnest. According to his assistant, **Jean Walbridge**, the first act of business Tuesday is the weekly meeting of the Cabinet at 9 a.m. After lunch, Chancellor Boschini is scheduled to meet with the executive committee of the Faculty Senate, sit for an interview with a *Dallas Morning News* reporter, then greet the TCU Staff Assembly at a called meeting.

The remainder of the week's calendar is booked with visits from various TCU administrators. On Friday, several Cabinet members will accompany Dr. Boschini downtown to the Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce's annual meeting. He'll have his first out-of-town trip Sunday, when he flies to Chicago for a Conference USA Presidents' meeting.

Jean notes the new Chancellor will be spending his first several weeks here familiarizing himself with people and programs on campus and getting to know his way around Fort Worth. ♦
