## New wellness program starts Aug. 1, targets faculty, staff, spouses

CAMPUS RECREATION AND HUMAN resources, in conjunction with The Life Center (specialists in wellness programs) announce the UNITY Wellness Program will be offered on campus, beginning Aug. 1. It is available to benefits-eligible faculty, staff and their spouses, at a cost of \$20 for Recreation Center members and \$40 for non-members.

UNITY will create an individualized 16-week program for each participant. There is an initial profile questionnaire and evaluation, along with measurements of blood pressure, body fat and girth. A Life Center nurse will counsel each participant in setting up their own plan. Then, a variety of health, nutrition and fitness resources will be factored into helping each person successfully meet their goals and complete the program.

Participation will be kept confidential. Those who meet their goals at the end of the program will be refunded \$20 and receive a free, one-year membership to the University Recreation Center.

Educational Programs (COA). The COA, which approved TCU's request earlier this summer, is the nation's only accrediting body for nurse anesthesia programs.

Approximately 60 students have already been accepted into the first-year program and will begin classes this fall.

"We are very excited to have an accredited nurse anesthesia program at TCU, with its strong history of nursing education," said **Kay K. Sanders**, director of the School of Nurse Anesthesia. "This program is desperately needed because there is a critical shortage of nurse anesthetists, especially in rural areas where hospitals depend on nurse anesthetists for surgery and obstetrics."

one of only a handful in the Southwest, must have a bachelor of science degree, be a Texas-licensed registered nurse and have at least one year of critical care experience.

During the first year of the program, students will study physiology, pathophysiology, pharmacology and chemistry on the TCU campus. During the final year, students will complete clinical residencies at one of 13 approved hospitals in Arkansas, California, Florida, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas, under the supervision of certified registered nurse anesthetists or doctors.

## Jazz Ensemble headed for Scandinavia after Netherlands appearance

THE TCU JAZZ ENSEMBLE, UNDER THE direction of **Curt Wilson**, is one of only three U.S. college bands chosen to perform at the prestigious North Sea Jazz Festival in The Hague, Netherlands. They leave Fort Worth Wednesday and will perform there Friday evening.

The three-day event attracts more than 100,000 music fans from around the world, and will feature Tony Bennett, Herbie Hancock, Randy Brecker, Roy Hargrove, Joe Lavano, Cassandra Wilson, Wynton Marsalis, Preservation Hall Jazz Band, Patti Austin and Chick Corea, among others.

The TCU group will then move on to the Copenhagen (Denmark) Jazz Festival for a July 13 gig, then to a jazz club in Stockholm, Sweden the next night. They're also scheduled to perform on the ferry to Helsinki, Finland, as well as two concerts at the Pori, Finland Jazz Festival July 16-17. They return from their tour July 20. ♦
