TCU to host ACE Fellow, Richard Durán of Baylor, during upcoming year

CHANCELLOR VICTOR J. BOSCHINI JR. HAS announced that Dr. Richard Durán, associate director of the University Scholars Program at Baylor University, will spend the 2003-2004 academic year on the TCU campus as an ACE Fellow.

The ACE Fellows Program, established in 1965 by the American Council of Education (ACE), is designed to strengthen institutions and leadership in American higher education by identifying and preparing promising senior faculty and administrators for more responsible positions in college and university administration. Fellows, nominated by the presidents or chancellors of their institutions, are selected in a national competition.

"We are fortunate to have Dr. Durán with us in the TCU community for the 2003-2004 academic year," says Chancellor Boschini. "My past experience with ACE Fellows tells me that we will gain a variety of benefits by having Dr. Durán participating in the life of TCU at this time of transition." He is expected to arrive on campus this week and will office in Sadler Hall, rm. 323.

A native of Fort Worth, Durán is among 36 Fellows named nationwide this year. Prior to his current position at Baylor, he had been a professor of French there since the mid-1980s. He also has taught at Southern Methodist University and the University of North Texas.

Durán received a B.A. degree in humanities from the University of Dallas in 1972, an M.A. degree in French language and literature from the University of North Texas in 1974 and a Ph.D. degree in French literature from Cornell University in 1983. ♦

Three new appointments to Neeley advisory board

Miller, who earned a degree in accounting at TCU, is the managing partner and a certified public accountant at PricewaterhouseCoopers in Dallas. Norwood, a Fort Worth native and 1972 graduate of TCU, currently serves as chairman of the board, president and CEO of Summit Bancshares, Inc. and Summit Bank, N.A.

Purcell is the managing partner of Continental Advisors, LLC, an SEC-registered investment adviser, managing financial services and healthcare sector hedge funds. He received a B.B.A. in finance from TCU and an M.B.A. in finance from the University of Chicago. ♦

The Main will offer all-vegetarian fare at innovative dining station

SODEXHO, WHICH HAS THE contract for dining services at TCU, is introducing a new concept at The Main in the Student Center. To be called "The Main Grain," the food bar will feature only vegetarian options for lunch and dinner, as an alternative to the other menu selections.

According to Bryant Currie (Sodexo's director of operations), organic vegetables will be featured, along with tofu and seitan. Foods will be prepared to order in three induction cookers, and the menu will include a rotation of vegetarian and vegan dishes.

Selections will include a variety of beans (Chana Dal, Adzuki, Yellow Eye Steuben, Borlotti and more), a variety of grains (bulghur, kasha, Quinoa, Kamut, Amaranth, etc.) and a variety of rices (basmati, purple sticky, Himalayan Red, wild, Wehani, saffron) and a number of pastas.

"This vegetarian sauté station will introduce many new flavors and out of this world sauces," according to Bryant. He says that adding The Main Grain is a
