DAYS WHEN THE UNIVERSITY IS officially closed because of bad weather conditions, all students, faculty and staff members will be excused from reporting, except for those employees providing essential services related to (1) health and safety, (2) the presence of a residential student community and (3) agreements with the public for the use of University facilities.

The decision to close the University will be made by 6:30 a.m. on the day in question and will be communicated to the TCU Webmaster to post on the home page, the TCU switchboard and local broadcast media. There also will be a recorded message, available by calling 817-257-INFO (4636). Members of the University community are encouraged to obtain their information from one of these sources.

### Neeley School appoints new IBOV members

THE NEELEY SCHOOL HAS APPOINTED Thomas N. Hund, executive vice president and chief financial officer of Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) and Brian D. O'Regan, regional vice president of Fidelity Investments Registered Investment Advisor Group, to serve four-year renewable terms on the school's international advisory board. The terms expire July 2007.

Hund and O'Regan join more than 40 other local, national and international senior-level executives providing program development and other guidance to the Neeley School's dean, faculty and staff.

Hund assumed his current position in December 2000. He previously served BNSF as senior vice president and chief financial officer. Hund began his career in the railroad industry with Santa Fe Pacific in 1983 in the accounting department and worked his way up to vice president and controller, a position which he held until the Santa Fe and Burlington Northern merger in 1995, when he was appointed vice president and controller of BNSF. Hund is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Illinois CPA society. He received a B.B.A. from Loyola University of Chicago and an M.B.A. from the University of Chicago.

O'Regan, the first professional hired to begin Fidelity's investment advisor business in 1992, relocated to Texas in 2002 to manage the business development services that cater to independent advisors in the south central region. O'Regan is the 2002 recipient of Fidelity's Outstanding Leader award. He earned a bachelor's degree from University of Massachusetts and is a member of the Financial Planning Association. O'Regan is also a registered representative and holder of several securities licensing registrations with both the National Association of Securities Dealers and the New York Stock Exchange. •
