## Budget, tuition, athletic conference voted on during trustees' session

TCU'S BOARD OF TRUSTEES FRIDAY approved a \$248 million budget for the 2004 - 05 academic year, one that further enhances students' academic experiences, improves student services and strengthens student scholarship and financial aid.

"A positive aspect of this budget is that it will allow us to hire 16 additional full-time faculty," said **Chancellor Victor J. Boschini Jr.** "This will reinforce our students' educational experiences by enabling them to engage in research with faculty either directly or in the classroom. Additional faculty also means smaller learning environments, a critical component in teaching and mentoring."

Other budget highlights include:

- \$4.5 million to strengthen scholarship and financial aid. Additional funds will be earmarked for undergraduate and graduate students, and for students wishing to study abroad

- \$3.1 million to support academic excellence which includes hiring 16 new faculty, new library acquisitions, faculty development grants, technology upgrades and support of academic programs

- \$2.1 million in capital funding for major parking improvements including new and resurfaced lots, fencing and lighting around remote parking areas, and increased shuttle bus service to remote campus parking and living areas

- Approximately three-quarters of a million to support student services such as University Career Services, Brown-Lupton Health and Counseling Center, orientation programs like Frog Camp and student and parent event programs

The Board of Trustees also set tuition for the 2004 - 05 academic year. New and returning full-time students will pay a combined tuition and fee of \$19,700 instead of the current rate of \$17,590. Continuing students enrolled prior to March 2001 will pay \$640 per hour in tuition and fees. Part-time students will pay \$685 to \$835 in tuition and fees per hour based upon the number of hours taken. Financial aid will be raised in proportion to the tuition increase. The increase represents an 11.9% adjustment over

## NCAA president and top collegiate leaders will debate ethics on Feb. 12

FROM ILLEGAL RECRUITING PRACTICES to player and coach misconduct to academic fraud, college athletics has faced its share of high-profile scandals in recent years.

On Thurs., Feb. 12, four of college athletics most influential personalities, including NCAA President Dr. Myles Brand, will gather at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum to discuss a wide range of ethical issues facing athletes, coaches and administrators in today's high-pressure sports world.

The panel discussion titled "Ethical Issues in College Athletics" will begin at 7:30 p.m. The event is free and open to the public. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m.

In addition to Brand, other panelists will include Roy Kramer, former commissioner of the Southeastern Conference and architect of the BCS; Andy Geiger, athletic director at Ohio State University; and University of Texas head football coach Mack Brown. Dutch Baughman, executive director of the

Division I-A Athletic Directors' Association, will moderate the discussion. The final portion of the program will allow audience members to ask questions of the panel.

"TCU is proud to host a discussion of 'Ethical Issues in College Athletics,' a subject of great interest nationally," says **Eric Hyman** (athletics director). "We are especially pleased to welcome such a prominent panel of speakers to share their opinions on this matter and look forward to a special night Feb. 12 in Daniel-Meyer Coliseum."

The event is sponsored by TCU, the Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce, the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram*, the Delta Gamma Foundation and the TCU Student Government Programming Council.

current tuition. Tuition and fees for graduate students are separate.

"TCU continues to provide students with an above-average educational experience at a below-average cost," said Chancellor Boschini. "Even with the increase, TCU will remain among the lowest-priced private, comprehensive universities in the Southwest and just below the average national tuition price for private institutions."

The trustees also voted to accept an invitation issued by the Mountain West Conference.

"We are excited about the opportunities ahead in the Mountain West Conference, but we also must say we enjoyed competing with the fine universities in Conference USA and others affiliated with that association," said Chancellor Boschini. "We leave with nothing but high regard for those institutions and will continue to work with them in many ways."

In other board business, Chancellor Boschini reported that 12th day spring enrollment numbers for the entire student body is 7,766, a 2% increase over last spring. The board also approved resolutions honoring **Dr. Michael R. Ferrari**, former TCU chancellor; **Jean Walbridge**, former assistant to the Chancellor, who retired last month; the late Dr. Cecil H. Green, a TCU trustee and founder of TCU's Cecil and Ida Green Honors Chair; and the late Dr. A.D. Weatherly, a TCU trustee.

The next trustees' meeting will be held April 1 - 2, immediately following the March 31 inauguration of Chancellor Boschini. ♦

She will focus on the gospels, including "Searching for the Historical Jesus" and "Two Portraits with a Difference - Luke and John."

Dr. Charles Kimball, religion professor at Wake Forest University, will present lectures Feb. 11 in UCC fellowship hall. His topics are "Toward Understanding Islam" at 9 a.m. and "Jewish-Christian-Muslim Relations: The Next Ten Years" at 11 a.m.

New to Ministers Week this year is the Davis Workshop in Ministry, established in honor of **Gilbert Davis**, former director of church relations at TCU, and his wife, Hilda. Noted church consultant, Dr. George W. Bullard, will present two programs on "Sustaining Vital Ministry," at 9 and 11 a.m. Feb. 12 in fellowship hall at UCC. He is widely recognized as an advisor to denominational leaders, a futurist, a strategic planning expert, a group process facilitator, a church growth strategist, an authority in conflict management and a writer. ♦
