## Angela Kaufman will join TCU as University Minister; alum returning mid-summer

THE REV. ANGELA A. KAUFMAN, WHO graduated from TCU in 1995, has been named Minister to the University, effective in July. She comes from DePaul University in Chicago where she has served as assistant director of University Ministry of the downtown campus since 2003 and chaplain for the College of Commerce and Kellstadt Graduate School of Business since 2002.

"The college years are a crucial time to support students as they explore their religious identity, as well as critically and reflectively develop their faith," Angela said. "I am honored to be joining the TCU family in such an important role."

Reared in Richardson, TX, Angela majored in philosophy and religion at TCU. She went on to receive a master's of divinity degree from the University of Chicago Divinity School in 1999 and continued her education with coursework in management, economics, human services and counseling at DePaul.

Her work in ministry began with summer internships with youth at Christian Churches in San Antonio and Brownfield, TX. After graduating from TCU, she became student pastor at Christian Church of Arlington Heights and began working at DePaul as residence hall minister in 1999.

Angela also has taught computer software classes at Valcom Inc., and at Columbia College in Chicago.

"I am thrilled that Angela Kaufman will become our next Minister to the University," says **Don Mills** (vice chancellor, student affairs). "She brings a unique combination of creativity, compassion and commitment to this vital role." ♦

THE NEELEY SCHOOL'S LUTHER KING Capital Management Center for Financial Studies (LKCM) is accepting applications for its High School Investor Challenge, a competitive finance program taught by TCU professors and professional security analysts. The program is designed to teach and foster the investing and portfolio management skills of 10 high school seniors. Each student will be charged with managing a \$10,000 stock portfolio over nine months.

There is no cost for this program and students must be entering their senior year in August 2004. Students will participate in a five-day summer program that will

prepare them for the nine-month challenge of portfolio management. Additionally, students will have the chance to compete for scholarships and earn three hours of academic credit at TCU.

"The Challenge is geared toward high-achieving, motivated students who have a strong desire to invest in the stock market," said **Joe Lipscomb**, professor of finance and real estate and director of the LKCM. "It is a very valuable program for the competing students because of its educational component and the exposure to seasoned professionals."

The Challenge's five-day summer program runs June 21 - 25. The students will receive hands-on instruction in Internet access to company data and training in the use of the TCU library securities and investments Web page. Securities analysts will act as coaches for the students and will demonstrate the use of the Bloomberg terminal to do comparative analyses on common stocks.

After completion of summer training, students will participate in monthly Saturday stock trading days beginning
