Chancellor's Staff Award to be presented at tomorrow's Opening Luncheon in Daniel-Meyer

MAKE PLANS TO ATTEND THE OPENING Luncheon, hosted by **Chancellor Victor J. Boschini Jr.**, tomorrow in Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. The event brings together all TCU faculty and staff to celebrate the beginning of the new academic year.

Buffet lines open at 11:15 a.m. in the lower concourse entrance area. Luncheon tables and seating will be on the floor of the Coliseum. Everyone is asked to enter the building through the lower level northeast concourse doors on the stadium side.

The **Rev. Angela Kaufman** will deliver the invocation. The Chancellor will introduce Chair of the Faculty Senate **Blaise Ferrandino** (School of Music), Chair of the Staff Assembly **Emily Burgwyn** (student affairs information services) and President of the Student Government Association **Jay Zeidman**.

Dr. Boschini also will present the Chancellor's Staff Award for Outstanding Service to one of the seven nominees chosen from each division of the University. Bronson Davis makes his retirement plans known

TCU VICE CHANCELLOR FOR Advancement **Bronson C. Davis** announced last week that he will leave his current position in December to serve as Consultant to the University, and then retire in January 2006.

"I became eligible for retirement over the summer and began to think about the future in a different way," Davis explained. "With TCU's current strategic planning project being completed this year, it seems an appropriate time for new leadership to come into advancement ... just before new initiatives in fund raising begin again. And I have had a book idea for a long time that I have been trying to pursue, and I also have had a growing interest at this stage in my professional life in possibly consulting and getting in touch more with what others are doing. So, what better time than this year?"

Davis came to TCU in December 1990 and has a long list of achievements to his credit:

- \$300 million was raised for TCU since 1990
 - The first comprehensive campaign, The Next Frontier, raised \$126 million
 - Another \$16 million in bequest expectancies was secured
 - The first phase of the next campaign raised another \$100 million
 - A highly professional Donor Relations Office was created
 - The Clark Society board was created (\$1,000 and above donor organization)
 - The Frog Club and Lettermen's Association were brought inside TCU
 - A Regional Council to lead advancement in nine cities was established
 - The Chancellor's Advisory Council for community/alumni leaders was created
 - Annual giving increased 104% from \$2.3 million to \$4.7 million
 - Alumni percentage of giving moved from 18% to 31%
 - Six buildings and eight athletic projects were funded and constructed
 - 12 academic positions were endowed
 - More than \$48 million in general endowment was raised
 - More than \$26 million in scholarship funding was raised
 - Alumni programming increased from 22 to more than 100 events
 - The number of alumni chapters in cities across the country increased from six to 20
- "There are few professionals out there who know the advancement profession as well as Bronson," said **Chancellor Victor J. Boschini**. "He has indeed served TCU

Bronson came to TCU from Tulane University, where he was Vice President for Development and Alumni Affairs. Before that he served Vanderbilt University in several positions.

He has a B.A. degree from DePauw University, and M.Ed. in Higher Education Administration from the George Peabody College at Vanderbilt. He served in the U.S. Army Security Agency in Ethiopia.

A search for Davis' successor will begin immediately. ♦
