Search begins for director of SoE's **Center for Urban Education**

A GRANT FROM TCU'S VISION IN ACTION (VIA) initiative will fund new programs and partnerships as well as allow a part-time director to join the School of Education's Center for Urban Education (CUE).

Since the initial plans for the Center for Urban Education in 1995, a group of School of Education professors have collaborated with teachers and schools to improve urban education in Fort Worth. In their TCU classes, the professors emphasize course material that is relevant to teaching in urban schools, said Cecilia Silva, an associate professor in the CUE.

The new director will implement professional development opportunities for urban educators in Fort Worth, maintain relationships with area teachers, increase funding for CUE research and programs and recruit underrepresented students in high school or at community colleges to teach in urban schools.
