Are we having a snow day? Check the TCU homepage first!

ON DAYS WHEN THE UNIVERSITY IS OFFICIALLY closed because of bad weather conditions, all students, faculty and staff members will be excused from reporting, except for those persons providing essential services related to (1) health and safety, (2) the presence of a residential student community and (3) agreements with the public for the use of University facilities.

The decision to close the University will be made by 6:30 a.m. on the day in question and will be posted on the TCU homepage as soon as possible. Closure information will also be given to the TCU switchboard and there will be a recorded message available by phoning 817-257-4636.

In addition, a campuswide e-mail will go out, and pertinent news will be relayed to the local media. Faculty, staff and students are encouraged to check one of the internal sources (Web, phone, e-mail) first rather than relying only on radio and television announcements.

Although all Metroplex radio stations and television channels 4, 5, 8, 11 and 23 will have received the information, their broadcast updates of TCU's situation could be delayed by the volume of weather-generated news they are reporting •

KUDOS

The School of Music will honor Curt Wilson, director of jazz studies, with a reception Nov. 30 in the Student Center ballroom immediately following the 7:30 p.m. concert of the TCU Jazz Ensemble in Ed Landreth Auditorium. Curt, who is celebrating 30 years as a member of the music faculty, will be recognized for his lifetime contributions to the field of jazz education.

Janice Brightwell Cobb, CPA and accounting instructor at the Neeley School, was awarded the 2006 Outstanding Accounting Educator by the Texas Society of Certified Public Accountants. The award recognizes Texas accounting educators who have demonstrated excellence in teaching and have distinguished themselves through active service to the accounting profession. At a ceremony held October 20 during the TSCPA Accounting Education Conference, Cobb received a plaque and a \$1,000 award provided by the TSCPA Accounting Education Foundation.

The TCU Drumline, under the direction of Brian West, took too honors in the recent Marching Percussion Festival College Drumline Competition held in Austin. The event is sponsored by the Percussive Arts Society International Convention. Last year, the TCU Percussion Ensemble won the "concert" competition at the same event. The back-to-back wins further establish the TCU program as one of the world's elite.

David Minor (Neeley Entrepreneurship Program) reports that four TCU students were finalists in the Collegiate Entrepreneurs Organization "Elevator Pitch" Competition held recently in Chicago. Another three made it to the semi-finals. Of the 100 schools represented and 1,100 students attending, no other school had more than one student make it to the finals. David, who says, "TCU was the talk of the conference," would like to thank Neeley colleagues Glenda Laney and Kelly O'Brien for helping prepare for this competition.

Lewis Glazer (graphic design) notes that eight TCU graphic design majors won 12 awards, including seven medals, in the prestigious Art Directors Club of Houston annual student competition. More than 20 schools from a multistate region were represented, including SMU, UNT and UT/Austin.
