2007 Pedometer Challenge kicks off this Wednesday

THE SECOND ANNUAL TCU PEDOMETER Challenge begins at noon Wednesday in Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. The eight-week fitness event runs through Wednesday, April 11.

The Pedometer Challenge kickoff will include fun and festivities. Participants from last year who kept their pedometer will receive a coupon from Campus Recreation good for one 30-minute nutritional consultation (the pedometer must be presented at the kickoff). Other activities include drawings for massages and fitness trainings, a campus-wide walking activity at the Coliseum (bring your walking shoes), testimonials from participants, and other giveaways.

This year, Campus Recreation worked with Technical Resources to develop an online tracking system that enables the teams to keep track of their progress. Each campus department, led by a team leader, should have its own team and all team members will receive a free pedometer to monitor their steps.

"The Pedometer Challenge is the opportune time to raise individual health-related awareness," said **Trey Morrison**, director of Campus Recreation's fitness and wellness program. "We had a very successful Challenge last year, and this year will be even better. This should also help develop lifelong health and physical activity changes within the TCU community."

Other benefits include having fun, increasing overall health, losing weight, strengthening your heart, decreasing stress, improving teamwork, and aligning with the VIA goal of developing a more pedestrian-oriented campus. Additionally, prizes will be awarded for individual and team performance.

Serious health risks are associated with being overweight, including Type 2 diabetes, stroke, heart disease, high blood pressure and several types of cancer. Being physically active, along with healthy eating, will improve participants' overall health and other benefits.

■ Today - Feb. 14: The retail portion of the store will remain available. Textbooks may be obtained by submitting a request in store to bookstore personnel.

■ Feb. 15 - 18: The bookstore will be closed for building relocation. No merchandise or textbooks will be available during this time. A smaller version of the bookstore will open Monday, Feb. 19 with limited merchandise.

■ Monday, March 5: The bookstore will reopen in the modular buildings on the site of the old bookstore and will offer retail merchandise and textbooks until the new bookstore is complete at the end of 2007.

Faculty/staff/students can apply for a passport Wednesday in Student Center

ALL TRAVELERS TO AND FROM THE UNITED States, Mexico, the Caribbean and Bermuda are now required to have a passport or other accepted document that establishes the bearer's identity and nationality to enter or re-enter the U.S. To make the process easier for those on campus, there will be a Passport Fair from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Student Center lounge. The event is sponsored by Mailing Services and the Student Center.

Passport fees are \$67/adults and \$52/children (under 16), payable to the U.S. Dept. of State by check or money order. The \$30 execution fee is payable to Postmaster by check, money order, cash, credit or debit card.

You must bring these two forms of identification: Proof of citizenship (certified birth certificate, previous passport, or naturalization certificate) and a current driver's license or state ID card.

All applicants must bring two identical photos (2x2 inches) if not purchasing on site. Photos taken on site are \$15. All applicants must appear in person, including minors.
