New AddRan Dean, Andrew Schoolmaster, begins today

DR. ANDREW SCHOOLMASTER HAS BEEN named dean of AddRan College of Humanities & Social Sciences and will begin serving in that role today.

Schoolmaster has established a strong professional presence and dedication in North Texas. After earning his doctorate and master's in geography and bachelor's in history, all from Kent State University, Schoolmaster taught for 24 years in the geography department at the University of North Texas where he transitioned from an assistant professor to professor and chair of the department. Prior to his move to Kentucky in 2004, he was associate dean for administrative affairs at UNT. Since 2004, Schoolmaster has been serving as dean and professor of geography in the College of Arts and Sciences at Eastern Kentucky University.

He is a member of the Council of Arts and Sciences, Association of American Geographers, Western Social Science Association and Sigma Xi among others. Schoolmaster's areas of expertise include environmental policy, recreation resource management, conservation of natural resources, survey research and data analysis and applied geography.

"The AddRan College of Humanities & Social Sciences is built on the rich heritage, core values and principles embodied in TCU founders Addison and Randolph Clark. Today, its excellent faculty, staff and programs provide knowledge, context and perspective critical to understanding the human condition at local, regional and global scales. I am honored to join such an outstanding and dynamic learning community and look forward to advancing the mission and vision of TCU," said Dr. Schoolmaster. ♦

THE NATIONAL HORNED LIZARD Conservation Society, in cooperation with TCU, the Fort Worth Zoo, the Nature Center and Crosswinds Ranch, will hold a biennial meeting July 27-29 in Fort Worth.

The gathering starts at the zoo, with tours of the "Texas Wild" exhibit where a horned frog breeding program is well under way. Papers of scientific and popular interest will be presented at the Kelly Alumni & Visitors Center, along with a small exhibit of printed materials provided by the TCU Library. Books and other

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horned toad memorabilia will be offered for sale, with proceeds benefiting HLCS.

On the final day, the group will meet at the Fort Worth Nature Center then move to the nearby home of Joyce Roach, Crosswinds Ranch.
