Celebrate the 2007-2008 academic year at Friday's Opening Luncheon

JOIN WITH THE TCU COMMUNITY AS WE COME together for our annual Opening Luncheon, hosted by Chancellor Victor J. Boschini Jr., Friday in Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. The event traditionally brings together all faculty and staff to celebrate the beginning of a new academic year.

Buffet lines open at 11:15 a.m. in the lower concourse entrance area. Tables for the seated luncheon will be on the floor of the Coliseum. Everyone is asked to enter the building through the lower level northeast concourse doors on the stadium side.

Rev. Angela Kaufman, minister to the University, will deliver the invocation. Chancellor Boschini will introduce Chair of the Faculty Senate Stu Youngblood (management), Chair of the Staff Assembly Darron Turner (assistant vice chancellor, student affairs) and President of the Student Government Association Jace Thompson.

Dr. Boschini also will present the Chancellor's Staff Award for Outstanding Service to one of the seven nominees chosen from each division of the University. They are Donna Shepherd (athletics), Ann Sewell (Brite Divinity School), Tara Perez (finance and administration), Margaret Kelly (marketing and communication), Mary Kincannon (Provost/academic affairs), Steve Kintigh (student affairs) and Nancy Madsen (University advancement).

TCU signs lease for natural gas drilling 2008 - 2010

THE UNIVERSITY LAST WEEK ANNOUNCED THE signing of a lease with Four Sevens Resources Company, Ltd., to drill for natural gas north of the football stadium in remote campus parking. The decision to sign the lease follows meetings with neighborhood leaders, faculty, staff and students to address their questions regarding safety, noise and traffic related to drilling. Four Sevens was appointed the University's natural gas operator by the Executive Committee of TCU's Board of Trustees last spring after a review of proposals submitted to the University as part of a request-for-proposal process.

The drilling site will be monitored, appropriately

secured with fencing, and inspected throughout the drilling procedure by state and local officials. Truck traffic will be routed to streets away from dense neighborhood areas to minimize traffic congestion and city noise ordinances will be followed. Parking will be relocated to other University parking lots.

Drilling will occur between the months of January through July in 2008, 2009 and 2010. Drilling will not occur during football season. Once drilling is complete, the University will landscape the site with trees and shrubbery and secure the area with attractive wrought iron fencing.

Any funds secured through drilling will be placed in the University's endowment, a decision made by the TCU Board of Trustees last spring.

compensation at TCU, the IRS has indicated that the new implementation date for any changes will be Jan. 1, 2008 and will not impact faculty/staff compensation until the 2008-2009 academic year. HUMAN RESOURCES WILL OFFER A THEATER-based program on preventing violent behavior on campus on Friday, Aug. 24 in Rms. 205-206 at the Student Center. "The Fury from Within" is scheduled for 9 - 10:30 a.m. and will be repeated from 1:30 - 3 p.m.

Administration, faculty, staff and students are encouraged to attend one of the presentations, which will examine critical situations in which violent behavior can erupt, acknowledges some problems institutions face with screening applicants for potential violence, offers state-of-the-art information to prevent and/or contain violence, and suggests responses should violence occur.

The program is presented by SST Communications, a training company that uses a theatrical approach combining factual information with comedic and dramatic vignettes to motivate audiences toward solutions.
