Chancellor Boschini will address University Convocation on Sept. 11

CHANCELLOR VICTOR J. BOSCHINI JR. WILL address the University community during Convocation at 11 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 11 in Ed Landreth Auditorium. Faculty and administrators in full regalia will lead the colorful procession, marking the opening of TCU's 135th year.

Classes will be dismissed from 10:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. to allow faculty, staff and students to attend. Line-up for the academic procession will form in front of Ed Landreth at 10:45 a.m.

Chancellor Boschini also will present the Chancellor's Award for Distinguished Achievement as a Creative Teacher and Scholar.

Nominees are nine faculty members who have already received their School and College awards this year: Mike Katovich (sociology/criminal justice/anthropology) and Darren Middleton (religion) from AddRan College, Bob Greer from the Neeley School, Paul Witt (communication studies) from the College of Communication, Becky Taylor (education) from the College of Education, John Owings (School of Music) from the College of Fine Arts, Linda Moore (social work) from Harris College of Health & Human Sciences, John Breyer (geology) from the College of Science & Engineering and Stacey Floyd-Thomas from Brite Divinity School.

The Wassenich Award for Mentoring in the TCU Community will be presented to a member of the faculty or staff in recognition and celebration of this person's mentoring of students. The honor was created in 1999 through an endowment established by TCU alumni Mark and Linda Wassenich of Dallas. Because of their own rich experiences as TCU students, the couple founded

the unique mentoring award to highlight the value TCU places on key relationships with faculty and staff which help students develop, succeed and contribute to their communities.

This year's finalists are: John Singleton (international student services), Becky Taylor (education), John M. Thompson (Neeley School) and Steve Weis (engineering).

University organist Joe Butler will play for the processional and recessional. The TCU Concert Chorale and the TCU Women's Choir, under the direction of Ron Shirey, will perform the Texas premiere of Gloria in Excelsis Deo composed by accompanist Janet Pummill. Richard Estes (music) will lead the singing of the Alma Mater.

University minister Rev. Angela Kaufman will deliver the invocation and Rev. Newell Williams (president of Brite Divinity School) will give the benediction.

As long as offices are covered, all faculty, staff and students are encouraged to attend.

A campus-wide Founders' Celebration will begin as soon as Convocation lets out, on the east campus lawn near the statues of Addison and Randolph Clark. Music will be provided by a jazz quintet. In the event of rain, it will be moved to the Student Center ballroom.

To continue a tradition begun in 2004, a collection of Clark family memorabilia is on display in Mary Couts Burnett Library, Sept. 11 through Nov. 16. Items include family photos, documents and personal effects, as well as the first Horned Frog yearbook from 1897-1898 and a 1908 photo of the Waco campus. ◆

College of Education will dedicate new Mabee Education Complex on Saturday, Sept. 15

TCU AND THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION WILL host a dedication ceremony for the new J.E. and L.E. Mabee Foundation Education Complex on Saturday, Sept. 15 at 11 a.m. The ceremony will be followed by an open house, including interactive demonstrations and presentations by TCU students and faculty.

"This is a most exciting day for the College of Education at TCU. Our facilities now match the quality of our faculty, staff, and students," says Sam Deitz, the school's dean. "Our programs preparing teachers, counselors, special educators and educational leaders will be enhanced with these new facilities as will the research and productivity of our faculty."

The restoration of the Bailey Building and the construction of the new Betsy and Steve Palko Hall completed the Mabee Foundation Education Complex. The ceremony will recognize the building name donors, including J.E. and L.E. Mabee Foundation, Inc. and Mr. and Mrs. Steffen Palko, and numerous other supporters. TCU and the College of Education were able to raise \$11.5 million, which exceeded its original goal of \$10.2 million. The project broke ground in April 2006 and was completed in time for the fall 2007 semester.

The new Mabee Foundation Education Complex houses 13 additional classrooms, a 150-seat auditorium, conference rooms, patio and lounge areas for students, offices for faculty and staff and the latest in teaching technology and laboratories. The plans called for the complete restoration of the Bailey

College of Education. The existing building was completely restored to its original facade and the interior reconfigured. A three-story glass atrium joins the Bailey Building to Palko Hall and includes a much-needed elevator to improve accessibility.

Classrooms and offices throughout the complex are connected with both wired and wireless technology to ensure the most advanced and flexible capabilities. The facilities were designed to transmit and receive information, especially for in-service development courses for teachers. Some of the rooms were designed to simulate actual teaching environments, providing a great opportunity for education students to learn in a real-world environment. In addition, the building's classrooms were designed with the help and input of the professors who teach there:

"The College of Education is proud to have such an excellent facility to continue its progress toward preparing educators to meet the challenges and realities of the 21st century," Sam concludes. "This new complex ensures that teachers from TCU are prepared in facilities equal to or better than those in which they will teach."
