Harris College awarded \$1 million grant to launch oncology education and research center

HARRIS COLLEGE OF NURSING & HEALTH Sciences has been awarded a \$1 million five-year grant from UT Southwestern Moncrief Cancer Foundation. The grant will enable the start of a highly productive partnership between TCU and UT Southwestern Medical Center that will result in significantly improved education for nurses in the area of oncology, as well as significantly improved cancer patient care in Tarrant County and all of North Texas.

"We are thrilled to collaborate with the TCU Harris College of Nursing & Health Sciences on this exciting new program," said Kim Pollock, associate vice president for cancer programs at UT Southwestern. "The student rotation in the Harold C. Simmons Comprehensive Cancer Center will highlight the valued role our oncology nurses have on the multidisciplinary team caring for cancer patients."

"We hope this experience will encourage more nurses to enter the field of oncology nursing and participate in oncology nursing clinical research," said Pollock.

The grant will focus on enhancing oncology education and research with a focus on three areas: undergraduate and graduate curriculum at TCU, research by TCU nursing faculty and strengthening the relationship between UT Southwestern, TCU and Tarrant County area

"This will offer opportunities in oncology nursing for undergraduate and graduate students that would not be possible without this generous gift," said Paulette Burns, dean of Harris College. "The undergraduate students will have the option for additional coursework in oncology nursing and graduate students will be able to specialize as clinical nurse specialists in oncology
