TCU collaborates on traveling exhibit of Texas maps, opening Friday in Dallas on 2-year run

TCU'S CENTER FOR TEXAS STUDIES IS partnering with the Museum of the Big Bend at Sul Ross State University in Alpine to produce "Going to Texas: Five Centuries of Texas Maps," an exhibit of 64 historic Texas maps from the Yana & Marty Davis Map Collection.

"There's so much here that you can learn about Texas history," says **J. Edward Townes**, assistant director of the Center for Texas Studies. "You watch Texas grow and redefine itself through these maps."

The exhibit, featuring maps dating from 1548 to 2006, will travel around the state for a period of two years, beginning Nov. 2 - Jan. 3 at the Old Red Museum in Dallas, and ending with a November 2009 - January 2010 showing at the National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame in Fort Worth.

The exhibit will also travel to Panhandle Plains Historical Museum in Canyon (March 13 - April 24, 2008), Museum of the Southwest in Midland (May 8 - June 19), Mayborn Museum Complex in Waco (July 3 - Aug. 14), Museum of South Texas History in Edinburg (Sept. 4 - Oct. 16), Museum of Texas Tech University in Lubbock (Nov. 6 - Dec. 18, 2008), Centennial Museum in El Paso (March 5 - April 16, 2009), and the Old Jail Art Center in Albany (June 6 - Sept. 6, 2009).

The Center for Texas Studies at TCU is an interdisciplinary center whose mission is "to celebrate all that makes Texas distinctive." In 2006, the Center for Texas Studies completed its Texas Flags exhibit, which was viewed by more than 300,000 people.

The Museum of the Big Bend at Sul Ross State University collects and interprets the history and cultures of the Big Bend of Texas and northern Mexico.

Art & Art History to receive large group of Andy Warhol photos for permanent collection

RON WATSON, (CHAIR, ART & ART HISTORY) was recently notified that his department is one of 183 college and university art museums across the country which will be given a collection of original Andy Warhol photographs. The Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts in New York City announced the unprecedented donation in honor of the organization's 20th anniversary.

There are 28,543 Polaroid photos and gelatin silver prints, valued in excess of \$28 million, in the collection being divided.
