Get wintry weather closure information on your cell phone via TCU ALERT!

ON DAYS WHEN THE UNIVERSITY IS OFFICIALLY closed because of bad weather conditions, all students, faculty and staff members will be excused from reporting, except for those employees providing essential services related to (1) health and safety, (2) the presence of a residential student community and (3) agreements with the public for the use of University facilities.

The decision to close the University will be made by 6:30 a.m. on the day in question and will be sent to the campus community as soon as possible via the new TCU ALERT textmessage system, as well as a campuswide e-mail and a posting on the TCU homepage. Closure information will also be recorded on 817-257-4636 and relayed to local media.

Additionally, the campus community should check one of the internal sources (text message from TCU ALERT, Web, recorded phone information, e-mail) first rather than relying only on radio and television announcements.

Although all Metroplex radio stations and television channels 4, 5, 8, 11 and 23 will have received the information, the volume of weathergenerated news they must deal with could delay updates of TCU's situation.

Remember, TCU will only use TCU ALERT text messages to cellphones during major emergencies or weather-related campus closures. If you have not yet added your cellphone number to your personal contact information, go to my.tcu.edu to update. •

- Driver License Renewals (You can renew your license one year before it expires)
- Texas Identification Card Renewals and First Time Application for ID Cards
- Duplicate Driver License or ID Card (lost, change of address, change of name, etc.)
- Transfer of Out-of-State License for Texas License (if no examination is required)

Helpful Reminders:

- Only services not requiring an examination will be provided
- Cash or personal check is needed for fee payment
- Maximum renewal fee for a Driver License is \$24 (\$32 with motorcycle endorsement)
