Kathy Baker named director of **Doctor of Nursing Practice program**

KATHY BAKER HAS BEEN NAMED DIRECTOR of Harris College's Doctor of Nursing Practice program. She joined Harris College of Nursing & Health Sciences as an associate professor in 2007. Previously she was a nurse researcher at Arlington Memorial Hospital, where she still serves as a consultant. Prior to Arlington Memorial Hospital, she held positions at Presbyterian Hospital of Dallas, Parkland Memorial Hospital and University of Texas at Arlington. Dr. Baker has been active in the nursing field since 1981.

Dr. Baker, editor of Gastroenterology Nursing, is an active researcher, author and presenter on internal medicine and nursing issues and trends. She also serves on the regional editorial advisory board for Advance for Nurses and is the past editorial assistant for the Journal of Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Nursing.

She is a current member of the World Association of Medical Editors, Council of Science Editors, Oncology Nursing Society, International Transplant Nurses Society, Southern Nursing Research Society, Sigma Delta Tau, Society of International Gastroenterological Nurses and Endoscopy Associates (SIGNEA), and Society of Gastroenterology Nurses & Associates (SGNA). Along with being recognized with many honors and awards, Dr. Baker has also held leadership positions and been active in numerous other nursing and professional organizations.

Dr. Baker earned her Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin, a M.S. in nursing from Texas Woman's University and a B.S.N. from Baylor

Center for Health Aging seeks participants for senior exercise program

THE CENTER FOR HEALTHY AGING, IN THE Harris College of Nursing & Health Sciences, is seeking participants for a supervised exercise program beginning in August. The 16-week program includes classes on Wednesdays and Fridays from 1:15 to 2:15 p.m. in the Rec Center. Registration deadline is July 21.

The group exercise classes, designed for anyone age 60 or above, are comprised of a warm-up, followed by flexibility, cardiovascular, strength, and balance training according to each participant's level of functioning. Classes will be conducted by a certified exercise instructor.

The goals of the exercise program are to help seniors become more physically fit, lose weight, increase strength and flexibility, and improve

their overall quality of life, while having fun and making new friends.

The fee for the program covers 32 sessions with a four-month membership to the TCU Recreation Center. Also included are fitness assessments at the beginning and end of the program. Rec Center membership includes access to a state-of-the-art strength training facility, indoor track, cardiovascular equipment, indoor and outdoor pools, racquetball and squash courts, and sauna and locker room use. Equipment orientations are available by Campus Recreation personnel upon request.

The exercise program is open to anyone age 60 or older who is medically fit to participate (as approved by their physician). Cost for the program is \$200 total, with a minimum of 12 participants (maximum of 20), or \$120 if registrant already has a TCU Rec Center

Advertising Campaigns team wins third runner-up honors at national competition

TCU'S NATIONAL STUDENT ADVERTISING Competition (NSAC) team took third runnerup as the wildcard entry at the national convention of American Advertising Federation (AAF) held in Atlanta, Georgia. TCU's Advertising Campaigns team was selected for the wildcard spot in the NSAC after taking second place in the district level competition at the District 10 convention, one of the largest districts in the nation, in Dallas on April 17.

The winner of this year's competition was Ohio University, with first runner up going to Art Center Design of Albuquerque, second runner up going to the University of Virginia, and the third runner up going to TCU. At the NSAC, TCU's Advertising Campaigns team competed against 16 other teams and 15 of the original 17-member team participated.

Each year, the AAF teams with a corporate sponsor and students are asked to research the product and its competition, identify potential problem areas and devise a completely integrated communications campaign for the client. This year, students researched, prepared and pitched a campaign for the 2008 NSAC client, AOL Instant Messenger.
