Six scholarships to be announced at Youth Entrepreneur event

THE NEELEY SCHOOL OF BUSINESS CHOSE 21 Texas high school entrepreneurs to be recognized at the 7th annual TCU Texas Youth Entrepreneur of the Year Awards Banquet this evening in the University Union ballroom.

The group was singled out for their success in founding and operating their own businesses. Their work lives range from concert venues to web design to outdoor catering.

The Neeley Entrepreneurship Center's annual scholarship competition rewards Texas' most impressive high school entrepreneurs. For two days on campus, the 21 finalists consult with successful entrepreneurs, learn about the Neeley School's award-winning entrepreneurship program and experience college life. The students have been interviewed by a panel of judges who select the six award recipients.

The Grand Award winner receives a \$5,000 scholarship. Five other winners receive \$1,000 scholarships each. All scholarships are doubled for those who attend TCU. Scholarships are funded by Compass Bank.

"Entrepreneurship is a vital force to the economy, so we want to support these students and help them realize their dreams of independent success as they go on to college to hone their business skills and broaden their knowledge and impact," said **Brad Hancock**, director of the Neeley Entrepreneurship Center. ♦

THE ASIAN STUDIES PROGRAM AT TCU welcomes Dr. Alejandro Chaoul to present his research on Tibetan yogic practices and their migration to the Western medical clinic on Wednesday, Feb. 11 at 4 p.m. in the Brown-Lupton University Union.

Chaoul is involved in research using Tibetan mind-body techniques with cancer patients and facilitates meditation for cancer patients and their support systems at their place of wellness. His publications have focused on the role of mind-body practices in integrative cancer care and research, as well as Tibetan meditation and ritual practices within religious studies, humanities and the intersection of humanities and medicine. He is also the director of the Limincha Texas Institute for Tibetan meditative and healing arts.
