Two of the Bard's most popular plays: his tragedy of young love, *Romeo and Juliet*, and his delightful romantic comedy *Twelfth Night* will be staged in repertory now through June 28 in the Jerita Foley Buschman Theatre and the Marlene and Spencer Hays Theatre. ## 1,400 Advanced Placement teachers coming here between next week and July 17

THE FIRST OF GROUP OF ADVANCED PLACEMENT educators from Texas and beyond will spend next week here as the annual TCU Advanced Placement®(AP) Summer Institute unfolds on campus.

A total of 1,400 teachers are expected to attend one of the three week-long sessions presented by the Office of Extended Education. TCU's AP Summer Institute, one of the first and largest in the country, has trained over 14,000 teachers, who in turn have educated well over 100,000 students, since its inception in 1994.

In addition to the June 22-26 session, others are scheduled for July 6-10 and July 13-17. "It is an excellent opportunity to represent TCU to educators and potential TCU students," said **David Grebel** (director, extended ed).
