

Those We Honor



Honorary Alumnus Award to Leo Potishman

founder and president of Vit-A-Way, Inc., Fort Worth, a processed mineral-vitamin additive firm formed in 1939 which now serves 36 states and produces nine products for sheep, cattle, horses, hogs and poultry. Mr. Potishman is president of Santa Fe Grain Co. and Frisco Grain Co., both of Frisco, and of Farwell Elevator Co. of Farwell. He is a vice president of Lena Pope Home for children, and founded both the Potishman Foundation and the Leo Potishman Foundation, the latter organization benefitting TCU by providing funds for publication of books through the Department of Sociology and University Press.



Honorary Alumnus Award to Jack K. Williams

president of Jack Williams Chevrolet Co., Fort Worth. A graduate of the University of Arizona, he attended law school at Stanford and later became a general merchandise salesman for the Ilfeld Co. in Albuquerque. He joined the Chevrolet Division of General Motors in El Paso in 1939. After seven years with Central Service, Inc., a management corporation, he became associated with Dumas Milner Chevrolet in 1958 and formed his own dealership in 1961. He is a former director of Trinity Valley School for Boys and Goodwill Industries, past president of the New Car Dealers Assn., received the Lions Club Outstanding Citizen Award in 1960, and has been actively interested in young people. His son is a junior in TCU.



Valuable Alumnus Award to William H. Michero '48

Corporate Secretary, Tandy Corporation, Fort Worth. After receiving a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from TCU, he joined the Tandy Corporation where he held a succession of management assignments including merchandising, advertising, credit, personnel, real estate, and subsidiary executive management. He was elected Corporate Secretary in 1960 after heading the company's operations in Boston and New York. Mr. Michero is a member of the Newcomen Society in North America and a number of professional and civic organizations. He was chairman of TCU/Fort Worth Week in 1969. Mrs. Michero is also a TCU graduate. They have two children, a freshman son and a junior daughter, enrolled in the University.



Distinguished Alumnus Award to General Paul P. Douglas '48

Commander, 836th Air Division, MacDill Air Force Base, Fla. General Douglas attended Arkansas State Teachers College before entering the aviation cadet program in 1941. During World War II, he flew the P-47 Thunderbolt in the European Theater of Operations. He is one of the most highly decorated Air Force officers. Following the war, he entered TCU and received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. He returned to the service and continued a distinguished career through numerous assignments in the U.S. and abroad.



Special Award to Miss Elizabeth Shelburne '20

retired Dean of Women and director of the Brown-Lupton Health Center, Miss Shelburne enrolled as a freshman at TCU in 1916, majoring in English. After serving at Carr-Burdett College in Sherman, she returned to TCU in 1929 as a math instructor (a former special interest) and dorm mother in Jarvis. the only women's dormitory on campus. In 1935 she was named Assistant Dean of Women and was promoted to the deanship two years later. After 24 years as dean, she retired and was appointed administrative assistant for health services, a position she held until 1967. The 1966-67 TCU Horned Frog was dedicated in her honor. Since health prevents her from being present for the 1969 Homecoming events, her award will be accepted by her brother, Mr. R. M. Shelburne of Sherman.
