Talbott Says Site In Colorado Fits All Requirements

DENVER, June 22 (AP). — The proposed Colorado Springs site for the Air Force Academy meets all requirements for the \$126,000,000 installation, Air Force Secretary Talbott said here Tuesday.

Talbott said he hopes to make his final choice of three proposed sites by Monday. That would be several days earlier than previously announced.

"I think you could say all three sites would be magnificent locations for the academy," Talbott said in an interview. He added, however, "one of them is probably more magnificent than the others."

Meanwhile, in Washington the Air Force informed Representative Price of Illinois Tuesday that it has received 1,700 telegrams in the past two days from Principia College alumni protesting the proposed location of the Air Force Academy at Alton, Ill.

Senate Leader Seeks July 31 Adjournment

WASHINGTON, June 22 (AP). — Senate Republican Leader Knowland of California said Tuesday that in shooting for a July 31 adjournment he plans daily sessions, including Saturdays, lasting until about 7 p. m.

He also informed his colleagues that as soon as the last of the appropriations bills have received committee approval, he may ask the Senate to start its sessions an hour in advance of the usual noon hour.

Examinations to fill vacancies as automotive machinists at the Fort Worth Quartermaster Depot have been announced by the U. S. Civil Service Commission.

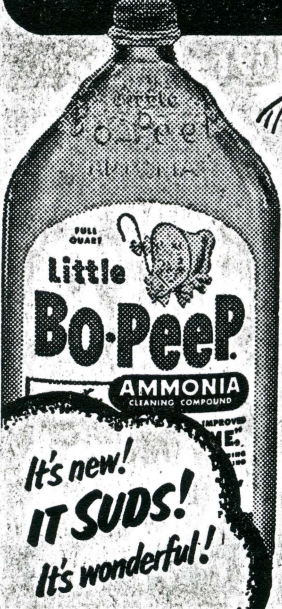
