Dear Amon:

Thank you very much for the time you gave Colonel Faversham when he was in Fort Worth the end of May. He told me that you were disturbed because you had not been able to give more time to the League. However, I want you to know that I appreciate your position and feel that your interest as shown by being Director of the League is of great value to us.

At the present moment we are putting into effect an expanded publicity program, the main objective of which will be to better acquaint people throughout the country with the purpose of the League. After Labor Day we will commence our new organization drive, at which time we hope to obtain as members of the League leading citizens in communities in every state of the Union. This program will be inaugurated in three states, namely, Missouri, Texas and Michigan, and our experience gained in these states will be helpful in formulating our plans for the remaining states. Sometime during the later part of the summer Colonel Faversham will call upon you again and request your advice and assistance as to the people we should contact in the leading cities of Texas, and in Fort Worth in particular. We will then arrange a series of meetings in the cities concerned and at that time attempt to put before the gentlemen invited to the meetings the objectives of the League, its means of accomplishing them and request they support us by joining up as members.

I hope that if you are in New York during the summer you will contact me, or, if I should be out of town, my Executive Vice President, Colonel Jake Smart.
