Here with I hand you communication which I have just received from the Provost Marshal General. I sincerely hope something definite may be available within the very near future.

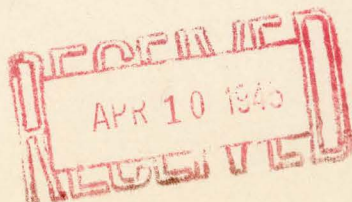

Dear Senator Connally:

I have received your letter of 30 March 1945, inclosing a copy of a telegram from Mr. Amon Carter, Fort Worth, Texas, wherein he requests information regarding a list of names of prisoners of war interned at Oflag 64 who have been transferred to other camps within Germany.

Reports received from the Swiss Government through the State Department state that prisoners of war interned at Oflag 64 have been transferred to two different locations. Part of the prisoners have been transferred to Stalag 3A at Luckenwalde, Germany, and others to Oflag 13B at Hammelburg, Germany. No information has been received as to individual names of those transferred, and in the absence of such information mail should continue to be addressed to Oflag 64, Germany.

I trust this information is sufficient to enable you to reply to Mr. Carter.
