Here are copies of letters I have written to the Tarrant County legislative delegates, which are self-explanatory.



Dear Keith:

Fort Worth Air Terminal, Inc. will be incorporated underthe laws of Texas to operate the Greater Fort Worth International Airport. Its capital is furnished by leading Fort Worth businessmen and institutions.

It is my opinion that Section 64, Article 1302 and Section 78 of the same Article are probably broad enough to cover the operation of an air terminal, but aviation has certainly reached the point now that no question should exist about the right of a Texas corporation to operate an air terminal, and I hope that you can amend the Article to include a new Section which will specifically cover the exact situation. I am enclosing herewith a draft of the amendment which I think is sufficient, although you may want to add something to it.

Will you give this matter preferred attention as it is critical and you will, of course, want to add an emergency clause to make it immediately effective. I am also writing Salty Hull and Bill Abington in the House so that the bills may be started on their way immediately.

cc to Honorable H. A. Hull Honorable W. H. Abington Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas;

Section. That a new subdivision be added to Article 1302, Chapter 1, Title 32, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended, and the same shall hereafter read as follows:

"109 -- Corporations may be created to, or after being created may so amend their charters as to engage in the business of operating terminals for aircraft, with power to buy, construct, lease, own, operate and maintain airports and air terminals and to buy, construct, lease, own, operate, maintain and convey buildings, ramps, runways, hangers, fueling and fuel storage facilities, shops, beacons and navigation aids of all kinds, and to buy, lease, own, operate and hold real and personal property needed in the transaction of its business; to receive, purchase, hold, use, grant and convey such leases, rights, privileges, franchises and property and to exercise beyond the jurisdiction of the State such powers as may be granted or conferred upon it by other jurisdictions and to maintain offices and agents at all points where it is doing business."
