Allow me to congratulate you heartily on the editorial in the Star-Telegram of July 18, pointing out the errors and injustice of the so-called "Share-the-Wealth Plan for Tidelands". This scheme is simply a maneuver to try to gain support for those who are resisting our just and equitable effort to restore and confirm the title of Texas and other states to the submerged lands.
