The past two years I have gone through innumerable reams of red tape to assist a German National and his wife to enter the United States on the immigration quota. I am very much in need of their services, know them personally, and will vouch for them one hundred per cent. Our friendship started when he was a prisoner and my orderly during the war, and I have since visited them in Germany. They have been cleared through all the boards and were proven definitely not Nazis. All preliminary work toward their immigration has been completed, and they have been assigned quota number:

After numerous promises that their visa would be granted shortly by the Consul, they have moved from their displaced quarters at Koln to Bremen to be near the Consul, and are sweating out the hours and weeks and months. From information I can gather, the Consul at Bremen has a great deal to say about who is next on the quota, and it occurred to me that you might be able to request assistance from someone in the State Department or the Senate to expedite this matter which has become very important to me.

I do not wish to impose on your time, but would be eternally grateful if you would aid me in this matter.
