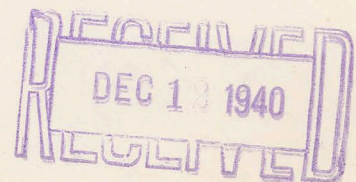
The way things are going, I believe that Fort Worth will assume a permanent important place in the Consolidated picture, in the near future.
