**Fort Worth Ceremonies Honor
Globe-Circling B-50 Crewmen**

FORT WORTH, April 7 (AP) — The men who flew the "Lucky Lady II" non-stop around the world were honored here today.

A big street parade and a dinner highlighted ceremonies hailing the flight of the B-50 bomber which circled the globe—Fort Worth to Fort Worth in 94 hours and one minute.

The plane took off from Carswell air base on Feb. 26 and landed the morning of March 2. It refueled in flight four times.

Capt. James G. Gallagher, the pilot, and 12 crew members were presented medals at a formal ceremony at the dinner and made honorary citizens of Fort Worth.

The medals bore the crew member's name and the words, "Fort Worth to Fort Worth—first non-stop flight around the world—94 hours 1 minute—Feb. 26-March 2, 1949—B-50 bomber Lucky Lady II."

Earlier today a plaque was unveiled at Carswell air base by Amon Carter, jr., on behalf of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram.
